BJP SANKALPA PATRA: A NEW HOPE FOR DELHI

A sthe date of polling is drawing closer for the elections of the legislative assembly of Delhi, the people are coming out in large numbers in support of BJP, expressing their immense faith in its programs and policies. The 'BJP Sankalpa Patra' has kindled a new hope among the masses who are suffering under the decade-long misrule of the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) government in the NCT. The AAP government, which has become synonymous with corruption, the loot of public money, regressive policies, and betrayal of public trust, has seen its leader, Arvind Kejriwal, backstab the people with his false promises, failure on every front, and politics of the lowest level. "FIGHT AGAINST THE INDIAN STATE" STATEMENT, REFLECTS THE THINKING OF CONGRESS: JP NADDA

BJP National President and Union Minster Shri Jagat Prakash Nadda addressed the Samvidhan Gaurav Abhiyan in Ahmedabad, Gujarat on 19 January 2025. During his address, Shri Nadda highlighted the 75-year journey of the Constitution. He strongly criticised the interference with the fundamental spirit of the Constitution during Congress rule and the imposition of the Emergency. He also emphasized the constitutionally aligned actions taken by the government of the Bharatiya Janata Party. Gujarat CM Shri Bhupendra Patel, and other senior leaders were on the stage during the event.

Shri Jagat Prakash Nadda said the sacred land of Gujarat has been a guiding force in India's cultural, political, religious, and spiritual movements, as well as in the awakening of the nation's self-identity. Be it Swami Dayanand Saraswati, Mahipal—the King of Saurashtra who built the Somnath

Temple, Mahatma Gandhi who played a pivotal role in India's independence, the Iron Man of India, Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, or the most popular leader in the world today, Shri Narendra Modi, Gujarat has consistently played a significant role in every sphere of leadership. On 26 November 1949, the Constituent





'Samvidhan Gaurav Abhiyan' in Ahmedabad

Assembly approved the Constitution of India, which came into effect on 26 January 1950. However, when we talk about the Gaurav Yatra—whether considering any era or subject—it inevitably includes its share of ups and downs. As we reflect on this 75year journey, we must remember the history of these years along with its highs and lows.

'Implementing Article 370 would be a betrayal of the nation'

The BJP National President said, out of the 75 years since independence, the Congress ruled the country for 65 years and positioned itself as the custodian of the Constitution. When the Constitution was being approved in 1949, its architect, Dr Bhim Rao Ambedkar, had remarked that no matter how good a Constitution may be, if the people implementing it are bad, the Constitution will fail. Conversely, he noted that even if the Constitution is flawed, it will succeed if implemented by good people. After India gained independence, the Iron Man of India, Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, successfully integrated 562 princely states into the Indian Union within just two years. However, regarding Jammu and Kashmir,

Jawaharlal Nehru insisted that the matter be handled by him. This led to circumstances in Jammu and Kashmir that resulted in the implementation of Article 370. While Sheikh Abdullah, the father of Farooq Abdullah, was drafting Article 370 in collaboration with Jawaharlal Nehru, the then Law Minister Dr Bhim Rao Ambedkar strongly opposed it.

Dr Ambedkar remarked that these individuals want Bharat Mata to provide them with food, build roads for them, and yet be considered equal to the Government of India, which he deemed an act of treason. Dr Bhim Rao Ambedkar firmly stated that implementing Article 370 would be a betrayal of the nation and declared that it would not be enacted as long as he was the Law Minister. Despite his opposition, Jawaharlal Nehru proceeded with the move and introduced Article 35-A alongside Article 370. This provision stipulated that while a citizen of Jammu and Kashmir would automatically be a citizen of India, a citizen of India would not have the same status in Jammu and Kashmir. The result of Article 35-A was a separate head and a separate symbol for Jammu and Kashmir.

"Do Nishan, Do Pradhan aur Do Samvidhan"

Shri Nadda stated that Congress and Rahul Gandhi today pretend to be concerned about the dignity of Parliament. However, their party had introduced Article 35-A as part of Article 370 by getting the President's signature without informing Parliament. Dr Syama Prasad Mookerjee, the founder of Jan Sangh, had famously said that "Do Nishan, Do Pradhan aur Do Samvidhan" cannot work in one country. For his stance, Dr Syama Prasad Mookerjee was arrested and died under suspicious circumstances in Srinagar jail. He sacrificed his life for the unity of the country. When his mother demanded an inquiry into his death, Jawaharlal Nehru refused to allow the investigation. What Jammu-Kashmir received from Article 370 was a situation where, until 2019, there were no reserved seats for Scheduled Tribes (ST) in the state, nor were there seats in the Lok Sabha and Vidhan Sabha for the Gujjar, Bakarwal, and tribal communities. The 126 laws passed by the Indian Parliament were not applicable on the soil of Jammu-Kashmir. Laws protecting women from crimes were not enforceable in Jammu-Kashmir and the POCSO Act did not apply there. Additionally, if a woman from Jammu-Kashmir married someone from another state, she was deprived of her property riahts.

Complete abrogation of Article 370

The BJP National President said that the children of the Valmiki community who migrated from Punjab to Jammu-Kashmir were restricted to working as sanitation workers. However, when the people of the country voted for Shri Narendra Modi and made him the Prime Minister on 6 August 2019, Shri Modi's willpower and Union Home Minister Shri Amit Shah's strategy led to the complete abrogation of Article 370. Today, the people of the Valmiki community are recognized as



citizens of Jammu-Kashmir. Shri LK Advani served as the Deputy Prime Minister, Shri IK Gujral became the Prime Minister and Dr Manmohan Singh held the office for 10 years—all of them hailed from West Pakistan. However, those who migrated from West Pakistan and settled in Jammu-Kashmir were denied basic rights, including the ability to become a Pradhan or an MLA in the Jammu-Kashmir Vidhan Sabha. Such a blind law was Article 370. This highlights the difference between a good lot and a bad lot.

Imposition of the Emergency in India

Shri Nadda highlighted that on 12th June 1975 the Allahabad High Court ruled against Indira Gandhi and invalidated her election. The court's decision stated that she could not contest elections for six years, citing the misuse of the Model Code of Conduct. At that time, the country was not in danger, nor was anyone at risk; however, Indira Gandhi's position was in jeopardy. To secure her position, internal disturbances were manufactured, leading to the imposition of the Emergency in India on June 25th 1975. During this time, fundamental rights, including Article 19 and Article 21, were suspended. Senior leaders of the country, such as Atal Bihari Vajpayee, Lal Krishna Advani, Morarji Desai and others, were imprisoned. Over 135,000 people were arrested under MISA (Maintenance of Internal Security Act) and DIR (Defence of India Rules).

Censorship was imposed

The BJP National President pointed out that it is a matter of great pride that the largest number of individuals connected to the BJP's ideology were those who were jailed, but they did so in their fight for freedom and against the Emergency, putting in all their effort.

• The editorial of Indian Express was censored, as

was the editorial of The Statesman and censorship was imposed. Thousands of families were displaced, with the breadwinners sent to jail, some of them spending two years behind bars.

- In many families, both the husband and wife were imprisoned, leaving their children alone.
- Such cruelty was unleashed by Indira Gandhi, solely to save her position.
- The most crucial point is how bad people can manipulate even a good constitution.
- Indira Gandhi brought in a law under which, for the first time, the President of India, the Vice President of India, and the Speaker of the Lok Sabha were exempted from judicial review.
- This meant that no legal action could be taken against them.
- To save her position, these laws were enforced with retrospective effect.

Indira Gandhi introduced 39th and 42nd Constitutional Amendments

Shri Nadda mentioned that Indira Gandhi introduced the 39th and 42nd Constitutional Amendment Acts.

- The 42nd Amendment concentrated power in the executive and diminished the judiciary's role.
- This meant that laws passed by Parliament would be exempt from judicial review, essentially creating a new constitution—a sort of mini-constitution.
- Such governments, which claim that no law will apply to them, that any wrong actions they take will not be subject to the law and that the laws they pass cannot be challenged in any court, should not have existed.
- Indira had become arrogant and unyielding.
- They had stated that no constitutional matter could be brought before them and that judicial review would not be allowed.
- They introduced the word "secular" merely to gain votes, and also added "socialism."
- On this issue, Dr Ambedkar argued that the term "secular" was unnecessary in our country because we have always acknowledged all religions as equal. Hence, there was no need to specifically include it.
- The word "secular" should be adopted by those who presented their constitution as an Islamic state.

- However, India has always followed a secular path, driven by the principle of "Sarva Dharma Sarva Sambhav" (respect for all religions).
- That's why the word "secular" was not needed, as emphasized by Dr Ambedkar during the debates in the Constituent Assembly.
- Dr Ambedkar said about socialism that in India, the decision regarding the government should not be made by the government itself, but by the people.
- The people should choose the government they desire, and the term "socialism" could not be included in the constitution.
- However, Indira Gandhi, in an attempt to allure and mislead the public with slogans, added both the words "secular" and "socialism."

Rahul Gandhi lacks historical knowledge

Shri Nadda stated that all the events during that time were like a dark night, with the Emergency being declared overnight and a blatant violation of the constitution. However, after Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi assumed office, Article 370 and Article 35(A) were revoked. Furthermore, when Shri Morarji Desai became Prime Minister, the 38th Constitutional Amendment, which had placed the President, Vice President, and Speaker outside judicial review, was brought back under judicial review. The provisions of the 42nd Amendment Act, which had stated that no court could challenge the constitution, were reversed, restoring the constitution within the purview of the judiciary.

During the Emergency, the term "internal disturbance" was explained as a situation where there was an organized effort against the nation, threatening its stability, which could justify the imposition of an emergency. Today, Congress leader Rahul Gandhi stated, "It is a fight against the Indian state." Rahul Gandhi lacks both historical knowledge and a proper understanding of the issue.

PM Modi Ended Triple Talaq

The BJP National President pointed out that Shah Bano was a divorced woman, and the Supreme Court had ruled that she should be given maintenance and compensation. In the Shah Bano case, when the Supreme Court ordered maintenance to be provided to Shah Bano, Rajiv Gandhi altered the law under

pressure from Muslim leaders and clerics, denying Shah Bano her rightful maintenance. Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi ended the triple talaq law and gave the right to live freely to crores of Muslim women, this is a good result of the Constitution.

Indira Gandhi imposed President's rule 50 times

Shri Nadda stated that the President's rule was imposed more than 100 times across states. Indira Gandhi imposed it 50 times, former Prime Minister Dr. Manmohan Singh imposed it 8 to 9 times, and Rajiv Gandhi also imposed it many times. However, since the government of Shri Narendra Modi came to power, President's rule has not been imposed in any state.

14 April as Rashtriya Samrasta Divas

The opposition often speaks highly of Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar, but it was the government of Shri Narendra Modi declared 14 April as Rashtriya Samrasta Divas.

- A memorial was built at his birthplace in Mau, Shiksha Bhoomi was established in London, Deeksha Bhoomi was created in Nagpur, Mahaparinirvan Bhoomi was constructed in Delhi, and Chaitanya Bhoomi was built in Mumbai.
- By building these memorials, Shri Modi elevated Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar's status in society.
- The Congress had even refused to award Baba Saheb the Bharat Ratna, but it was the BJPsupported government that honoured Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar with the Bharat Ratna.

BJP National President Shri Nadda remarked that on 26th January 2025, India will celebrate its 76th Republic Day, but we must remember that in the 75 years of Gaurav Yatra, there have been those who tampered with the Constitution, those who attempted to destroy its fundamental provisions, and those who worked to protect it. We must also recognize which government worked to highlight and safeguard the vision of Baba Saheb. As we embark on the Samvidhan Gaurav Abhiyan, we should take pride in our history and remain vigilant against those who show off their knowledge but fail to truly understand it. These individuals carry the book of the Constitution yet have never read it, know nothing about it, and are unaware of what their forebears did, which they should be well-informed about.

Bharat Ratna Babasaheb Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar: A staunch nationalist

Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar's Vision of a United, Strong Hinduism

- Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar advocated for abolishing caste to create unity and strength among Hindus.
- His vision of Hinduism is a united strong Hinduism, battle-ready and prepared to take on Abrahamic religions.

He said, "So long as caste remains, there will be no Sangathan, and so long as there is no Sangathan, the Hindu will remain weak and meek..."



His critique of caste emphasized the damage it caused to Hindu unity

- This aligns with the BJP's emphasis on overcoming social divisions and fostering a united, strong Hindu identity.
- It is in this context that one could understand why he was extremely appreciative of all genuine reform work by Hindu nationalists.
- He expressed open appreciation for the works of Veer V.D. Savarkar and Swami Shraddhanand both Hindu Mahasabha leaders.





Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar on Islam

- Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar viewed Islam as an alienating force.
- He explained that the brotherhood of Islam is "for Muslims only," creating division, rather than promoting universal brotherhood.

Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar in his writing,

"Pakistan Or The Partition Of India", wrote, "The distinction that it makes between Muslims and non-Muslims is a very real... very alienating distinction."

Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar's Condemnation of Purdah

 Babasaheb Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar strongly criticized the practice of purdah in his book "Pakistan Or The Partition Of India", calling burkha-




clad women "one of the most hideous sights one can witness in India."

 He condemned the restrictive social practices that limited Muslim women's rights and mobility, stating they could only see a few male relatives and were barred from praying in the mosque.

Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar's Opposition to Religious Reservations

- Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar opposed religious or community-based reservations that favored certain groups, warning it would undermine equality of opportunity.
- He argued that the focus should be on uplifting those who have been historically oppressed, rather than creating separate categories based on religion which will be a threat to a unified national identity over sectarian interests.





While addressing the Constituent Assembly on 30th Nov 1948 he argued,

"Supposing, for instance, reservations were made for a community or a collection of communities... could anybody say that the reservation of 30 percent as open to general competition would be satisfactory from the point of view of giving effect to the first principle, namely, that there shall be equality of opportunity?"

Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar's Opposition to Special Status for Kashmir

- Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar strongly opposed the demand for special status for Kashmir, as it contradicted national unity and integrity.
- He felt that the provision would create another sovereignty within India which would be disastrous for the unity of the country.




Dattopant Thengadi and Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar's Influence

Addressing the gathering Shri Modi said that 15th January is commemorated as Army Day and saluted every brave warrior who would sacrifice his life for the safety and security of the nation. He congratulated all the brave warriors on this occasion.

Remarking that today was a big day for India's maritime heritage, the glorious history of the Navy and the Atmanirbhar Bharat Abhiyan, the Prime Minister said that Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj gave a new strength and vision to the Navy in India. He added that today the Government had taken a major step towards empowering the 21st century Navy of India in the land of Shivaji Maharaj. "It is for the first time that the tricommissioning of a destroyer, frigate and submarine was being done", highlighted the Prime Minister. He emphasized that it was also a matter of pride that all the three frontline platforms were made in India. He congratulated the Indian Navy, all the stakeholders involved in the construction work and the citizens of India for the achievement.

CABINET APPROVES THE ESTABLISHMENT OF "THIRD LAUNCH PAD" AT SRIHARIKOTA

The Union Cabinet on 16 January chaired by the Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi on 16 January approved the establishment of the Third Launch Pad (TLP) at Satish Dhawan Space Centre of ISRO at Sriharikota, Andhra Pradesh. The Third Launch Pad project envisages the establishment of the launch infrastructure at Sriharikota, Andhra Pradesh for the Next Generation Launch Vehicles of ISRO and also to support as standby launch pad for the Second Launch Pad at Sriharikota.

This will also enhance the launch capacity for future Indian human spaceflight missions. The TLP is designed to have configuration that is as universal and adaptable as possible that can support not only NGLV but also the LVM3 vehicles with Semi cryogenic stage as well as scaled up configurations of NGLV. It will be realized with maximum industry participation fully utilizing ISRO's experience in establishing the earlier launch pads and maximally sharing the existing launch complex facilities. TLP is targeted to be established within a duration of 48 months or 4 years. The total fund requirement is Rs. 3984.86 Crore and includes the establishment of the Launch Pad and the associated facilities. The Project will boost the Indian Space ecosystem by enabling higher launch frequencies and the national capacity to undertake human spaceflight & space exploration missions.

PM MODI CONGRATULATES ISRO FOR THE Successful demonstration of space Docking of satellites

Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi on 16 January congratulated ISRO and the entire space fraternity for the successful demonstration of space docking of satellites. Shri Modi remarked that it is a significant stepping stone for India's ambitious space missions in the years to come.

The Prime Minister posted on X: "Congratulations to our scientists at @isro and the entire space fraternity for the successful demonstration of space docking of satellites. It is a significant stepping stone for India's ambitious space missions in the years to come."

The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) has successfully docked two SPADEX satellites in space, approximately 475 kilometres above sea level. ISRO said the mission demonstrated India's ability to dock craft in space. It becomes the fourth country to do so, after the US, China, and Russia.

The SpaDeX mission launched from the Satish Dhawan Space Centre on December 30, 2024. The two spacecraft, launched via an ISRO-developed Polar Satellite Launch Vehicle (PSLV), separated in space.

After the two 220-kilogram satellites completed

the docking process, they transferred electrical power before separating and activating their payloads.

Mod SIGNS CONTRACT WITH BDL FOR MEDIUM RANGE Surface to Air Missiles for Indian Navy

Ministry of Defence (MoD) on 16 January signed a contract with Bharat Dynamics Limited (BDL) for the supply of Medium-Range Surface-to-Air Missiles (MRSAM) for the Indian Navy at a cost of approximately Rs 2,960 crore. The contract was inked by the officials of MoD and BDL in the presence of Defence Secretary Shri Rajesh Kumar Singh in New Delhi on January 16, 2025.

The MRSAM system is a standard fit, onboard multiple Indian Naval Ships and is planned to be fitted on the majority of the future platforms planned for acquisition. The contract marks a critical milestone in the ongoing efforts to bolster India's defence capabilities and indigenise advanced military technology.

With the emphasis on 'Aatmanirbhar Bharat', the missiles would be supplied by BDL under 'Buy (Indian)' category with largely indigenous content. The contract would generate employment of approx. 3.5 lakh mandays in the defence industry, including various MSMEs.

1,561 CRORE CONTRACT INKED WITH HEAVY VEHICLES FACTORY FOR 47 T-72 BRIDGE LAYING TANKS FOR INDIAN ARMY

Ministry of Defence (MoD) on 21 January signed a contract with Heavy Vehicles Factory, a unit of Armoured Vehicle Nigam Limited, for the procurement of 47 Tank-72 Bridge Laying Tanks (BLT) for the Indian Army at a total cost of Rs 1,560.52 crore. The contract was inked by the senior officials of MoD and HVF/AVNL in the presence of Defence Secretary Shri Rajesh Kumar Singh in New Delhi on January 21, 2025.

The BLT is a critical equipment which is employed to launch bridges during offensive/defensive operations by Mechanised Forces. It provides integral bridging capability to the Tank and Armoured Vehicle fleet enhancing the battlefield mobility and offensive capability. The present case being a Buy (Indian-Indigenously Designed Developed and Manufactured) will give impetus to the Make-in-India initiative in defence. This project will also play a pivotal role in boosting the overall economy and increasing employment avenues in the country.

PM WELCOMES THE NAMING OF CULTURAL CENTER IN JAFFNA, AS 'THIRUVALLUVAR CULTURAL CENTER'

LAUNCH OF 'UTKARSH', SECOND MULTI PURPOSE VESSEL

The second of the two Multi Purpose Vessels, being built by M/s L&T Shipyard for the Indian Navy, was launched on 13 Jan 25 at L&T, Kattupalli, Chennai. The ship has been named 'Utkarsh' which means 'Superior in Conduct' and is synonymous to the multidimensional role envisaged for the platform. The contract for two Multi-Purpose Vessels was signed between Ministry of Defence and M/s L&T Shipyard on 25 Mar 22. These multi-Purpose Vessels will be capable of towing ships, launch and recover various targets, operate unmanned autonomous vehicles and act as a trial platform for various indigenous weapons and sensors under development. The 106 m vessels are designed to achieve a maximum speed of 15 knots.

'Kashmir participated in the Satyagraha', which advocated the removal of restrictions imposed on Indian citizens in the state of Jammu and Kashmir. He also strongly opposed the Liaquat-Nehru Pact, which was in line with Shri Mookerjee's vision of a strong and unified India. His clarity and conviction on these issues made him a respected leader in the party and an influential voice at the national level. This was a testimony to his unique leadership ability, which laid the foundation for giving a new direction to Indian politics.

Elected to Parliament in 1957, Atal Bihari Vajpayee's speeches on the Tibet crisis and India's defeat in the 1962 war left a profound and indelible mark on the country. His eloquence and in-depth analysis established him as a leading voice in Indian politics. He became the leading face of the Bharatiya Jana Sangh, known for his charisma and unparalleled ability to connect with the masses. This was the period when Nehru said that this young MP would one day occupy the PM's chair.

After the untimely demise of Pandit Deendayal Upadhyaya, Atal Bihari Vajpayee took over the leadership of the Jana Sangh. By maintaining the core principles of the party and balancing the need for broad political alliances, he established himself as a national leader. During the 1971 war, Vajpayee demonstrated his maturity and national outlook by rising above party politics and extending his full support the government. In 1974, to led the active participation he in the movement launched by Shri Jayaprakash Narayan, strengthening the fight for democracy and justice.

1975-77 was a defining moment for both Shri Vajpayee and the Jana Sangh. He played a key role in opposing the Emergency and authoritarianism and advocating the restoration of democratic norms. Despite the challenges, his leadership ensured that the party remained steadfast to its principles. The brief experiment of the Janata Party after the Emergency ultimately proved unsuccessful and led to the exit of Jana Sangh from the coalition.

BJP: Collective voice of India's nationalism

In 1980, after the dissolution of the Janata Party coalition, Atalji played a key role in reorganizing the Bharatiya Jana Sangh as the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP). As the first president of the BJP, Vajpayee laid the ideological foundation of the party, seeking to combine its nationalist roots with broader national interests. Under his leadership, the BJP adopted socialism and Indian nationalism as its guiding principles, giving the party a centrist outlook. Vajpayeeji's liberal image and emphasis on inclusiveness played a key role in garnering a diverse mass support base. His leadership kept the party alive during the initial struggles of the BJP and gradually brought acceptance as a mainstream political party. The party's vote share increased from 7.74% in 1984 to 20.1% in 1991 and this was due to Atal ii's leadership.

Atalji's greatest achievement was that he presented nationalism in a way that resonated with the Indian electorate. Unlike leaders who took a hardline stance, his approach was driven by generosity and pragmatism, especially that proved useful in difficult times. After 1992, his leadership helped the BJP overcome that political isolation, and the party subsequently succeeded in forging strategic alliances with regional parties.

De facto leader of Coalition politics

In his 65 years of active public life till 2009, Atal ji spent almost 56 years in opposition and only nine years in power. This journey of his political life will prove to be a guide to the politics of purity and principles in the future. His leadership in the 1990s was a turning point for the Bharatiya Janata Party. Atalji's ability to deal with the complexities of coalition politics became evident when he became the Prime Minister of India in 1996, though this tenure lasted only 13 days. But despite these political complexities, Atalii's speech in Parliament captured the emotions of the vast masses of the Country. The people answered the political betrayal with their votes in 1998 and Atalji returned to power adain.

During his tenure from 1998 to 2004, Vajpayeeji demonstrated a unique political ability in holding together a coalition of more than 20 parties. This was a unique example of taking everyone along while accepting the spirit of democracy and its integrity in the Indian Constitution. The stability of his government disproved the idea that coalition governments are inherently weak. Under his leadership, the BJP's seat share rose significantly to 182 in the 1998 general election, a testimony to his widespread popularity and vision.

Great Architect of Organization

Atalji's leadership was crucial in promoting unity in the BJP, often mediating between different viewpoints in the party. His moderate approach helped the BJP evolve as a nationalist party and a better and more credible alternative to the Congress.

Historic economic reforms were initiated during his tenure as Prime Minister. Corruptionfree, clean, and transparent governance gave the BJP the identity of a clean party. DEENDAYALJI WAS A 'DRASHTA', A SEER, NOT MERELY A PHILOSOPHER

andit Deendayal Upadhyaya was a nationalist to the core. He loved not only the abstract concept of "Nation" but also the nation in flesh and blood. But his patriotism did not prevent him from being an internationalist. Rather inter-nationalism was only the natural evolution of his enlightened nationalism. He had realised that affinity of an individual with different organisms. ranging from family to the Universe, was only an outward manifestation of the evolution of his consciousness. The more developed the consciousness, the larger and higher would be the organism with which

one is identified. But this being a process of evolution, the higher level of consciousness does not preclude the previous lower levels. It is inclusive, not exclusive, in character. One can be equally and simultaneously attached to all the organisms without doing injustice to any one of them. What is needed is a realistic, an integral view of things.

Even a human being must be considered in an integrated way; the body, mind, intelligence and soul of a person must not be thought of separately.

This realisation led Deendavalii expound his theory to of "Integral Humanism", which is in direct contrast with the compartmentalised thinking of the West. The latter has given rise to strife and struggle at all levels in all departments of life. The seed, the sprout, the trunk, the branch, the leaves and the fruit constitute one single, continuous process of evolution. They are not mutually conflicting or exclusive.

In fact, Panditji's comprehension was not confined to the human species. His integral-ism indicated

flowering of the human the consciousness into universal consciousness. That is why he was a humanist without being homocentric. Consequently he thought that the more appropriate term for his thought-system would be "Integralism". But in view of his field of practical activity he considered the term "Integral Humanism" more convenient in the immediate context, as a compromise between his ultimate concept and the common level of understanding in the field, even as his use of the term 'ism' was.

again, a similar concession to the common level of understanding which could not comprehend the grand 'ism'-lessness of the eternal Dharrna.

He was the first political leader of the country who added yet another dimension to the traditionally defined 'nation'concept. Every nation has its soul, its 'Chiti' he declared. The strength and energy activising the nation is its 'Virat'. It is channelised by 'Chiti'. The place of 'Virat' in the life of a nation is similar to that of 'Prana' in the body. Just as 'Prana' infuses

strength in various organs of the body, refreshes the intellect, and keeps body and soul together, so also in a nation, with a strong `Virat' alone can democracy succeed and the government be effective. "When the `Virat' is awake, diversity does not lead to conflict, and people cooperate

with each other like the various limbs of the human body, or like the members of a family." Panditji was, again, the first political leader in post-independence era to declare unequivocally that what `mankind needed most was a Dharma-Rajya, not merely a rule by majority. He took pains to explain how Dharma was different from Religion and Dharma Rajya from theocracy. But Dharma alone is supreme. State is one of the several institutions or instruments of Dharma an important one, but not above Dharma. It is subject to Dharma. Sovereignty

vests in Dharma. Dharma sustains the Nation. Consitution Even the Must be in tune with Dharma. The Articles of the Constitution violating Dharma must be considered null and void to that extent. Both Legisla-ture the and the Judiciary are on an equal plane. Neither is superior to the other. Dharma is higher than both; both are governed by Dharma. The people have a right to elect their own government. But neither the government nor the people have any right to act against Dharma.

Panditji was a votary of 'Bharatiyata' not only because it was

his national heritage. He was convinced that the maladies of humanity in general and India in particular could be remedied only on the strength of Bharatiya culture. Is it possible for the West to reconcile individual liberty with social discipline? In the materialistic West, liberty soon degenerates into licentiousness, and discipline into regimentation. The West could never conceive of basic organic unity in the midst of apparent diversities, for it mistook uniformity for unity. It could never appreciate the merit of the Bharativa socioeconomic order, for it mistook our stability for stagnation and its own adventurism for dynamism. Western thinkers could not conceive of a unitary form of government with maximum decentralisation of

> adminis-trative authority, because it is beyond their comprehension that there can be set up a central state authority without statism, and with regional, industrial and civic self-governments - which has been the special characteristic of the Bharatiya social order. The West considered national selfreliance incompatible with the spirit of international co-operation. In the West, nationalism can degenerate, into imperialism and inter-nationalism into disloyalty to one's own nation. The 'integral humanism' expounded by Panditji has exposed the inadequacies. lopsidedness. imbalance and futility of the compartmentalised thought-systems of the West. His integralism-enabled him to visualise the emergence of a World State enriched by the growth and

contribution of different national cultures, and evolution of 'Manava Dharma enriched by the perfection of all religions, including 'materialism'.

Deendayalji was a `Drashta', a seer, not merely a philosopher. Because of his `Sadhana. his identification with Dharma, he could, like a Time Machine, roll himself back and forth in the centuries and stand face to face with the ancient seers as well as unborn generations. He worked out for us the solutions of modern problems in the light of ancient wisdom. He foresaw and diagnosed

maladies that would afflict humanity in the distant future; and prescribed for them the remedies tested with success by 'Sanatana Dharma'.

It has been said that people without a vision perish. A nation without its 'Drashta' is doomed to decay and death. But our Dharma is Sanatana, i.e. endless as well as beginningless. It has, therefore, been the sacred mission of Bharat Mata to give birth, in every age, to Drashtas who deliver a message of hope to the otherwise frustrated mankind pursuing false ideals. In this age, Pandit Deendayal Upadhyaya has been the precious gift of this Dharma Bhumi to the bewildered.

"There is no chance for the welfare of the world unless the condition of women is improved. It is not possible for a bird to fly on only one wing." Inspired by this timeless vision. Prime Minister (PM) Narendra Modi launched BBBP on January 22, 2015, in Panipat, Haryana. This landmark initiative sought to address the declining child sex ratio (CSR) in India and ensure that girls and women across the nation have the opportunities, care, and dignity they deserve.

The 2011 Census revealed a deeply concerning sex ratio

at birth (SRB) of 918, a stark reflection of societal biases and the misuse of diagnostic tools. Through targeted, life-cyclefocused interventions, BBBP not only reversed this trend but also laid the foundation for a future where women will lead and thrive.

Over the past decade, the programme has catalvsed significant progress. According to the Health Management Information System, the national SRB has improved from 918 in 2014-15 to 930 in 2023-24. Institutional deliveries have surged from 61% in 2014-15 to 97.3% in 2023-24. while first-trimester ante-natal care registrations increased from 61% to 80.5%. Gross enrolment ratios for girls at the secondary level rose from 75.51% in



2014-15 to 79.4% in 2021-22. Additionally, the gap in infant mortality rates between male and female newborns has nearly disappeared, reflecting our commitment to equity in survival and care.

The **BBBP** movement has gone beyond improving statistics: it has redefined the narrative around women's empowerment. Initiatives such as the Yashaswini Bike Expedition - a 10,000-km journey by 150 women bikers in October 2023 - symbolised the indomitable spirit of India's daughters. The Kanya Shiksha Pravesh Utsav in 2022 re-enrolled nearly 100,786 out-of-school girls, showcasing the power of education transforming lives. in The national conference on skilling emphasised the importance of women's active participation in the workforce, bringing us closer to our vision of women-led development.

As we celebrate 10 years of this transformative programme, it is clear that the mission is far from over. If we are to become Viksit Bharat, it is imperative to ensure that girls and women



remain at the heart of our efforts. nation-building India cannot develop till its girls and women can live out their full potential. This is the time for us to take decisive action. We must strengthen the implementation of The Pre-Conception and Pre-Natal Diagnostic Techniques (PCPNDT) Act of 1994, address dropout rates in education. expand skill development programmes, and provide targeted interventions at every stage of a girl's life.

In FY24, the Female Labour Force Participation (FLFP) rate in India stood at 41.7%. While this is a significant increase from previous years, it is still below the Labour Force Participation of Men. Noteworthy also, is the fact that FLFP in urban areas is lower than that of rural areas. A large number of women in India are involved in unpaid domestic care work. Our endeavour should be to not only foster an environment for more women to leave the folds of their domestic spheres and take up employment outside the house but also to create a means to promote care work as a valid career and a profession, so women who are trained in care work and want to pursue it, can do so while also gaining financial independence and seeing their efforts contribute to the economic growth of the country. According to the World Economic Forum, closing the workforce gender gap could increase global Gross Domestic Product (GDP) by 20%. For India, this is not just an opportunity — it is a necessity.

Under the leadership of PM Modi, we are witnessing a historic transformation. From women's development to women-led development, the daughters of India are emerging as changemakers, entrepreneurs, and leaders Women-led development is central to achieving our goal of a trillion-dollar economy and becoming a developed nation by 2047. The BBBP programme has become a movement that has inspired millions and positioned women at the forefront of India's progress.

On this day Mahatma Gandhi returned to India

Recalling that it was on this day in 1915, Mahatma Gandhiji returned to India after a long stay abroad, Shri Modi remarked that the presence of the diaspora in India at such a wonderful time added to the festive spirit. Remarking that this edition of Pravasi Bharatiya Divas (PBD) was special for another reason, he said, the event was held after a few days of the birth centenary of Shri Atal Bihari Vajpayee, whose vision was instrumental to PBD. "Pravasi Bharatiya Divas has become an institution to strengthen the bond between India and its diaspora", he further added. Shri Modi highlighted that together we celebrate India, Indianness, our culture and progress along with connecting to our roots.

The great land of Odisha, where we have gathered, is a reflection of India's rich heritage, said Shri Modi. He added that at every step we could witness our heritage in Odisha.

The Prime Minister emphasized that he has always considered the Indian diaspora as ambassadors of India. Expressing his joy in meeting and conversing with fellow Indians around the world, he said that the love and blessings he receives from them are unforgettable and always stay with him.

Expressing his heartfelt gratitude to the Indian

diaspora and thanking them for giving him the opportunity to hold his head high with pride on the global stage, Shri Modi highlighted that over the past decade, he had met numerous world leaders, all of whom have praised the Indian diaspora for their social values and contributions to their respective societies. India is not just the mother of democracy, but democracy is an integral part of Indian life, he said.

Highlighting the incredible speed and scale of development in 21st century India, the Prime Minister remarked that in just 10 years, India had lifted 250 million people out of poverty and has risen from the 10th to the 5th largest economy in the world. He expressed confidence that India will soon become the 3rd largest economy.

India's achievement

Emphasising India's achievements, such as the Chandrayaan mission reaching the Shiv-Shakti point, and the global recognition of Digital India's strength, Shri Modi stressed that every sector in India is advancing to new heights, breaking records in renewable energy, aviation, electric mobility, metro networks, and bullet train projects. He highlighted that India is now manufacturing "Made in India" fighter jets and transport aircraft. He envisioned a future where people will travel to India for Pravasi Bharatiya Divas in "Made in India" planes.

The Prime Minister highlighted the importance of studying and researching the Girmitiya legacy and urged organizing regular World Girmitiya Conferences and directed his team to explore these possibilities and work towards advancing these initiatives.

Government trying with full sincerity to implement Gram Swaraj on the ground: PM

The Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi on 18 January distributed over 65 lakh property cards under SVAMITVA Scheme to property owners in over 50000 villages in more than 230 districts across 10 States and 2 Union territories today through video conferencing. Addressing the occasion, he remarked that today was a historic day for the villages and the rural areas of India and greeted all the beneficiaries and the citizens on the occasion.



SVAMITVA scheme launched five years ago

The Prime Minister remarked that five years ago, the SVAMITVA scheme was launched to ensure that the people residing in the rural areas receive their property cards. He remarked that different states refer to property ownership certificates by various names, such as Gharoni, Adhikar Abhilekh, Property Card, Malmatta Patrak, and Awaasiya Bhumi Patta. "Over 1.5 crore people have been issued SVAMITVA cards in the past 5 years", said Shri Modi. In today's program, he added that more than 65 lakh families had received these cards. The Prime Minister remarked that under the Swamitva Yojana, around 2.25 crore people in villages have received legal documents for their homes now. He extended his heartfelt congratulations and best wishes to all the beneficiaries.

Shri Modi remarked that despite having property worth millions of crores, villagers often lacked legal documents, leading to disputes and even illegal occupation by powerful individuals. He added that without legal documents, banks also kept their distance from such properties.

Property documentation through Swamitva

The Prime Minister highlighted that previous governments did not take concrete steps to address this issue. He said that in 2014, the Government decided to tackle the challenge of property documentation through the Swamitva Yojana. The Prime Minister emphasized that no sensitive government could leave its villagers in such distress. Elaborating on the Swamitva Yojana, he said it involved mapping houses and lands in villages using drones and providing legal documents for residential properties to villagers. He added that the benefits of this scheme are now visible. Referring to his earlier conversation with beneficiaries of the Swamitva Yojana, who expressed how the scheme has transformed their lives, Shri Modi remarked that they now receive assistance from banks for their properties, and their satisfaction and happiness are evident. The Prime Minister considered this a great blessing.

"India has over 6 lakh villages, with drone surveys completed in nearly half of them", remarked the Prime Minister. He highlighted that after receiving legal documents, lakhs of people had taken loans from banks based on their property, starting small businesses in their villages. He added that many of these beneficiaries are small and medium farmer families, for whom these property cards have become a significant guarantee of economic security. The Prime Minister noted that Dalit, backward, and tribal families were most affected by illegal occupations and long court disputes. He remarked that with legal certification, they would now be free from this crisis. He mentioned an estimate that once property cards are issued in all villages, it will unlock economic activities worth over 100 lakh crore rupees. The Prime Minister emphasized the substantial capital that will be added to the country's economy.


