





## **AAP-DA NAHIN SAHENGE...BADAL KE RAHENGE**

The announcement of dates for assembly elections in the National Capital Territory of Delhi has enthused the people hoping to see the end of the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) regime in the state. The 10-year misrule of the AAP government has seen rampant corruption, insensitive administration, false promises, and paralysed governance failing to address even the basic issues like health, education, roads, cleanliness, and drinking water in the capital city. Any analysis of the AAP's decade-long rule may instantly reveal the total failure of the AAP government on every front, making it what's now called a 'Decade of Disaster.' by the Congress regimes to suit its political interests, and the constitutional spirit and values were trampled under its authoritarian leadership. The Congress went to the extent of imposing Emergency on the country while suspending fundamental rights, jailing opposition leaders, censoring media, and enacting draconian laws like MISA. It has a history of dismissing and destabilising non-Congress state governments, causing huge damage to the federal structure of the constitution. In the centre also, it has destabilised the elected government many times, creating political instability in the country. As a staunch believer in dynastic politics, the loyalty of the Congress has remained limited to a single family at the top in complete contravention of democratic values and spirit enshrined in the Constitution. Its leadership has always treated constitutional institutions with contempt and undermined their jurisdiction whenever possible. It will not be wrong to say that the Congress stands for authoritarianism and dictatorship in the country.

The undemocratic character of the Congress was unveiled since the time of independence when the Congress leadership sought to humiliate and sideline the stalwarts of the time, including Babasaheb Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar. As Babasaheb had to suffer continuous insult and neglect, he was forced to resign from the Nehru cabinet under an extremely humiliating condition. # FOR DR. AMBEDKAR THE NATION WAS PARAMOUNT

The country is celebrating the 75th year of its Constitution. This is the time to "respect the Constitution". This is a historic journey of the Constitution which has established itself as a strong force by overcoming many obstacles and challenges. This is an achievement because the average age of most Constitutions of other countries that gained independence along with India has been 15 to 17 years. India has stood in the category of a successful democracy. At the time of this success, it is necessary to remember those constitution makers in which Dr. Ambedkar represents everyone as a symbol. Respecting the Constitution is respecting Dr. B.R. Ambedkar.

aba Saheb is the architect of the Constitution of India. Dr. Ambedkar was spiritual. He believed that the supreme conscious soul is present in everyone. He was the Chairman of the Drafting Committee and contributed to the drafting of the Constitution. Dr. Ambedkar's Constitution is based on the concept of "Atmavat Sarvabhutesh". If this were not so. such a beautiful preamble would not have come out. We all know that the soul of the Indian Constitution lies in its preamble. The preamble is the national objective of India. Its attainment is the desired goal. The preamble is the basic spirit or life element of the Indian Constitution.

Dr. Ambedkar spoke for the first time in the Constituent Assembly on 17 December 1946 and for the last time on 25 November 1949 when the Constitution was ready. He was elected Chairman of the Drafting Committee on 29 August 1947. We cannot mention all the speeches but his remarks of 25 November as the Chairman of the Drafting Committee are the essence of all, this speech is very meaningful and relevant in which he has explained the working system of the Constitution, the pre-conditions for the success of democracy and the apprehensions of its failure.

The first meeting of the Constituent Assembly on 9 December 1946 and the entire constitution was prepared in two years, eleven months and seventeen days for which a total of seventeen sessions of the Constituent Assembly were held. Out of these seventeen sessions, the first six sessions were spent in passing the objective resolution and considering the reports of the committees on Fundamental Rights, Union Constitution, Union powers, Provincial Constitution, Classes and Scheduled Areas and Scheduled Tribes. The draft of the constitution was discussed in the seventh, eighth, ninth, tenth eleventh sessions. These eleven sessions of the Constituent Assembly took 165 days. Out of these, the assembly spent 114 days in considering the draft of the constitution. He himself had placed these facts on the table of the House.

Baba Saheb's role as the architect of the Constitution is extensive

because he was the chairman of the drafting committee. In a way, he is synonymous with the Constitution. Almost all articles are some answer or suggestion, but it is necessary to mention some of his contributions.

One word is enough to commemorate his contribution to nation building and integration of the nation. Article 1 of the Indian Constitution states that "India That is Bharat shall be Union of States", India will be a 'Union of States'. This term paves the way for the process of integration of India.

His political life can be generally divided into two phases from an ideological point of view. The first stage is where Dr. Ambedkar is against the Indian National Congress. The second stage is the welfare of the untouchable society which is at the center of his thinking.

When he becomes the chairman of the drafting committee, nationalism is visible in his thoughts. Nation building and integration of the nation become the dimensions of his thinking. The Constituent Assembly, was vocal and clear on issues such as Uniform Civil Code, language, powers with the Centre etc.

As a Law Minister, he called his community to return from Pakistan, advised them not to accept Islam

and must pay attention to national interests. Here, Dr. Ambedkar emerges as an epochal leader.

For Dr. Ambedkar, the nation was paramount. He was a staunch patriot because the focus of his entire thinking was India and its future. His research from the London School of Economics was also about strengthening India's economy and his research from Columbia University also focuses on India's trade/business/ commerce. Therefore, we can say that wherever Dr. Ambedkar lived, his country was always there. India was the only thing that lived in his mind. Therefore, when we look at Dr. Ambedkar in totality, we see the greatness of his life. He gives a message to every Indian. "We are Indian Firstly and Lastly", this line looks simple to read but its meaning is equally deep.

Dr. Ambedkar was always against the forces supporting the divisive policies of the country. Before the partition of India, he exposed the conspiracies against India in Pakistan and Partition of India. In his speeches, he says that if Pakistan has to be created, then there should be "total exchange of Muslim population", that he advocated sending the entire Muslim population to Pakistan.

After the partition of India, the Nizam of Hyderabad did not merge with India and Dr. Ambedkar was very saddened by the continuous incidents of atrocities on Dalits by him and in Pakistan. Dalits were being forcibly converted to Islam in Hyderabad and Pakistan. Dr. Ambedkar, calling the Nizam of Hyderabad an enemy of India, instructed the Dalits there not to support him. His nationalism is clearly reflected here.

There was a natural apprehension in the Indian and Western world that how long will independent India remain independent. This question was also before Ambedkar. Being the chairman of the drafting committee, it was necessary to know its answer. Therefore, Dr. Ambedkar says that "On 26 January 1950, India will be an independent country". What will be the result of its independence? Will it be able to protect its independence or will it lose it again?

Dr. Ambedkar's second fear is about the future of the Indian Constitution. He says that when India becomes a republic on 26 January 1950, what will be the future of its democratic Constitution? Will we be able to protect it or will lose it again? This is the second thought that arises in his mind and disturbs him like the first thought.

The third question was what is the quality of the Constitution? Dr. Ambedkar connects the Constitution and political culture and says that "I believe that no matter how good the Constitution is, if the people implementing it are bad, then it definitely becomes bad". The functioning of the constitution does not depend entirely on the type of constitution. "The constitution is only a system which has been created for the smooth functioning of the various parts of the government. The future of the constitution depends on the form in which the common citizen participates in this political process.

In the context of India, he says three things for the success of democracy and constitution-

- 1. Abandoning the path of revolution
- 2. Discontinuation from personality worship
- 3. Coordination of political democracy with social and economic society.

It is the love of a good craftsman to keep the building constructed by him safe for a long time. He wants to keep it, so he resolves those fears also. Here Baba Saheb was in favour of keeping the Constitution flexible in the context of the challenges that would come in the future. The result of which can be seen today. Through this we can also see the significance and reality of the Constitution.

### Hon'ble Modi ji's National Democratic Alliance Government and Dr. Ambedkar

Hon'ble Modi ji's National Democratic Alliance (NDA) government has developed the places related to Dr. Ambedkar's life (Janmabhoomi, Shikshabhoomi, Mahaparinirvana Dikshabhoomi. Bhoomi Chaityabhoomi) as Panchtirth to propagate his ideas. As per the government's instructions, 26 November is being celebrated as 'Constitution Day' from 2015. As the chief architect of the Indian Constitution, Baba Saheb ensured that liberty, equality and fraternity became the strong foundation of independent India's democracy by providing a framework for the upliftment of the oppressed of the society and eliminating institutional inequalities.

Despite his unique contribution in nation-building, people at the helm of political power denied rightful place, the respect and prestige Baba Saheb deserved not only during his lifetime but even after his Mahaparinirvana. Congress, in their pursuit of political dominance, reduced his monumental legacy to a footnote. By doing this the Congress leaders betrayed not only Baba Saheb but also the very ideals he stood for.

For decades, Congress has claimed to champion social justice,

but their actions paint a different picture, one of resistance and indifference. Failure of Congress to honor him reflects this party's betrayal of his vision. Congress, embroiled in ideological hypocrisy, is now forced to remember Baba Saheb Ambedkar under compulsion. This same Congress family insulted Baba Saheb time and again and continuously tried to destroy his legacy. It was the result of Congress's jealousy towards Baba Saheb that Baba Saheb was posthumously honored only in 1990, there was a delay of 34 years in awarding him the Bharat Ratna. Jawaharlal Nehru In contrast. and Indira Gandhi of the same family received this award during their tenure. Similarly, Congress showed reluctance in installing the portrait of Baba Saheb in the Central Hall of Parliament and the demand for displaying his painting in the Central Hall was repeatedly rejected on the pretext of lack of space and protocol. It was only after mounting pressure from Baba Saheb's followers that the picture could be installed in the Central Hall on August 9, 1989, which was later removed. Lakhs of followers felt cheated by this act of Congress. Later, on April 12, 1990, the Portrait of Baba Saheb was again installed in the Central Hall by the BJPsupported government. While the belongings of Nehru and Indira Gandhi were carefully preserved, Baba Saheb's typewriter, books and other artifacts, were left to languish for decades. These are being

preserved by the Modi government by building Dr. Ambedkar Socio-Economic and Cultural Center in Chincholi, Nagpur and his eternal legacy is being brought to life.

Dr. Ambedkar's political journey was repeatedly obstructed by Congress, which reveals their discomfort with his transformative In the 1952 general elections, instead of supporting Baba Saheb's unopposed entry to Parliament, Congress fielded Shri Narayan Kajolkar against him, with Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru personally campaigning to defeat him. The betrayal continued in 1953, during the Bhandara by-election, where Congress fielded Mr. Van Khede to block Baba Saheb again and spread vicious propaganda regarding the practice of double voting to mislead the public. It is quite relevant to know here that in the first general election of 1952, the total number of rejected ballot papers was 74,333, but Baba Saheb was defeated by only 14,561 votes which was the result of Congress's planned propaganda.

Baba Saheb envisioned reservations as a tool to correct historical injustices and level the playing field, but Congress repeatedly obstructed these measures. Jawaharlal Nehru in his letter dated 27 June 1961 to Chief Ministers of the States criticised reservation and termed it "harmful to merit and efficiency". His remarks dismissed the structural barriers faced by marginalised communities. The Kaka Kalelkar Commission's

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1955 recommendations, which aimed to identify and uplift backward classes, were similarly shelved under Congress's leadership. The Mandal Commission's findings further exposed Congress's reluctance to embrace affirmative action. In an interview given by the then Prime Minister Rajiv Gandhi in Navbharat Times on March 3, 1985, he said "Don't promote idiots in the name of reservation." This remark also shook the soul of the entire marginalized community. When V.P. Singh's government implemented the recommendations of Mandal Commission in 1990, late Shri Rajiv Gandhi, the then Leader of Opposition, opposed the move, calling it divisive and regressive and termed it a barrier for the progress of the country. Even today, Congress's contradictions on reservations have persisted. Shri Rahul Gandhi, while giving his lecture at Georgetown University of America in the year 2024, regarding reservation, suggested that reservation should be abolished when the time comes. All these facts reflect the ideological hypocrisy of the Congress and its historical discomfort with the reservation system along with its selective approach towards the rights given to the Scheduled Caste people who have been victims of exploitation for centuries.

Often, Congress leaders claim that Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru appointed Baba Saheb Ambedkar as the Chairman of the Drafting Committee, but this distorts history. As revealed in a letter from Edwina Mountbatten, it was Eamon de Valera, the former Prime Minister of Ireland, who recommended Baba Saheb for the role. Recognising his unmatched brilliance and patriotism, Edwina hailed him as the only leader capable of ensuring justice for all classes and creeds. His appointment was a testament to his intellect and moral authority, earned through the sheer force of his ideas and unwavering commitment to justice.

On the contrary, the Modi government, following the principles and ideals of Baba Saheb, not only successfully implemented hundreds of public welfare schemes but also worked to provide the respect and prestige Baba Saheb deserved by considering sensitively all the aspects related to his life. Panch Teerth which commemorates key milestones of his life i.e. Janmabhoomi Mhow (Madhya Pradesh), Shiksha Bhoomi (London), Deeksha (Nagpur), Parinirvana Bhoomi (Delhi) and Chaitya Bhoomi (Mumbai) have been constructed. To honour Dr. Ambedkar's legacy and contributions, the Modi Government decided to celebrate 26th November every year as "Constitution Day" from the year 2015 on the occasion of the 125th birth anniversary of Dr. Ambedkar. On the occasion of Constitution Day 2023, a 7-foot-tall Panch Dhatu statue in lawver's attire has been unveiled in the Supreme Court complex, the Supreme Temple of Justice. Baba Saheb's vision has breathed new life through policies implemented keeping in mind financial inclusion and social justice. Beyond symbolism, the Modi government has implemented transformative policies aligned with Baba Saheb's vision. Initiatives like Stand-Up India and the JAM Trinity (Jan Dhan-Aadhaar-Mobile) promote financial inclusion and entrepreneurship among marginalised communities, breaking cycles of dependency and exclusion. The introduction of reservations for Economically Weaker Sections (EWS) further reflects a commitment to correcting historical and economic disparities. With the inspiration of Baba Saheb, more than 25 crore people have come out of the poverty line in the last decade through the schemes implemented by Modi Government.

Dr. B.R. Ambedkar was far ahead of his time. envisioning a future where justice and equality were not just aspirations but lived realities. As the chief architect of the Constitution, he embedded safeguards to protect the dignity of every citizen, ensuring that systemic barriers could be dismantled through legal and institutional frameworks. The Modi government's initiatives provide a roadmap for meaningful change, but the journey is far from complete. Institutions, civil society, and individuals must join in the effort to realise Baba Saheb's dream of a nation where justice, equality, and fraternity are not just principles but lived realities.

Today, the name of Baba Saheb is being used by the opposition parties in the country, mainly Congress, for political gains and under the influence of vote bank politics. It is evident to everyone who honored Baba Saheb and who acted in real terms to honour him. The time has come to fully embrace Baba Saheb's vision, not just in governance but in every aspect of society. Let this be our commitment, to honour his memory through action and to ensure that his ideals guide India's journey toward justice and progress.


# INDIAN CONSTITUTION IS 'HOLY BOOK' FOR PM MODI

It is going to be 75 years since the constitution came into force, now the question arises whether the basic foundation of our Constitution is being changed or amended? If it is being changed or amended then who has this right? Under what circumstances can it be changed or amended?

In the Preface is the Soul of our

Constitution, Dr. Ambedkar had said, "Can the soul be removed from the body?" If India is one country, then should one country-one Constitution be implemented or not? Can the wishes of religion, caste and parties be imposed

on the Constitution? These are such burning questions which are very important to think today. Many times, for vested interests, some people or political parties try to spread confusion and fear about the constitution among the public. believed in the Constitution, he would not have hugged those who raised Pakistan Zindabad slogans in Jawaharlal Nehru University and would not have supported those who instigated riots, would not have met the separatists of Jammu and Kashmir, would not have made cow slaughterers Congress office bearers and would not have advocated reservation on the basis of religion. Now everyone is familiar with the anti-Constitution working system of the Congress. The history of Congress is that despite Dr. Ambedkar's refusal, they abolished the reservation of tribals in the Vidhan Sabha by imposing Article 370 in Jammu and Kashmir, imposed emergency in the country in 1975 by unnecessarily crushing the spirit of the Constitution. toppled governments elected by the people by imposing Article 356, 90 times, deprived the Valmiki community of constitutional rights in Jammu and Kashmir, etc., which proves the anti-Constitutional

Not only this, he expressed his true respect for him by buying the rented house where Baba Saheb used to stay while studying in London and converting it into Shiksha Bhoomi. Dr. Ambedkar International Center was built at 15 Janapat Marg, Delhi at a cost of 192 crore.

Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi showned his respect by declaring these monuments as 'Panchtirtha', not brick and mortar buildings. Atal Ji and Advani Ji played an important role in getting 'Bharat Ratna' for Baba Saheb and display his life size portrait installed

in the Parliament. Baba Saheb wanted that for maintaining the unity and integrity of the country; social, economic, political justice and equality of opportunity should be available for all the poor and deprived, not for only few people on the basis of caste or religion, and this has also been mentioned in the Constitution. Draupadi Murmu from the SC & ST communities for the post of President: appointment of Governors in four states for the first time; appointment of Deputy Chief Ministers in two states, Madhya Pradesh and Rajasthan, and Leader of Opposition in

appointment of 12 Scheduled Caste and eight Scheduled Tribe people as ministers in the Central Government; for the first time after independence, appointment of a Scheduled Caste person to the post of Railway Board and tribal Shri Girish Chandra Murmu as the Comptroller and Auditor General, shows the respect to the Constitution and its spirit of equality in political and social opportunity.

andit Jawaharlal Nehru had been ignoring Bharat Ratna Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar before the independence of the country. He did not want Baba Saheb to become a member of the Constituent Assembly Constituent Assembly elections were held in July 1946 under the Cabinet Mission Plan 1946. The

British had conducted these elections in the undivided India which included India along with today's Pakistan and Bangladesh. Initially, it had 389 members, but after the partition of India and Pakistan this number decreased to 299. At that time 229 members were elected

from 12 Indian provinces and 70 members were nominated from 29 princely states.

Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar had contested the Constituent Assembly elections from Mumbai North. Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru did not want him to enter the Constituent Assembly under any circumstances. He entrusted the responsibility of making Baba Saheb lose the election to the Prime Minister of Bombay Presidency, B.G. Shekhar. Congress also used all its might to make Dr. Ambedkar lose the elections.

## How Baba Saheb was elected in constituent assembly

After Baba Saheb was defeated in the Constituent Assembly from Mumbai, there was a stir among the Dalits of India. They were disappointed that if Baba Saheb did not enter the Constituent Assembly, their interests would not be protected. Dalit leader of Bengal Jogendranath Mandal decided to get Baba Saheb elected from Bengal and send him to the Constituent Assembly. 5 MLAs were needed to make Baba Saheb win. At that time, 4 MLAs in Bengal

were from the Scheduled Caste, and to win, the support of one more MLA required and for which Jogendranath Mandal put in all his efforts. On 8 July 1946, Baba Saheb filed his nomination papers, whose proposer was Jogendranath Mandal and supporter was Nogendra Narayan Rai. To defeat him here too. the Congress fielded P. R. Thakur. a descendant of Jogendranath Mandal's philosophical guru Harichand Guruchand Thakur, against Baba Saheb. Jogendra Babu took the support of Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose's elder brother Sharat Chandra Bose to make Baba Saheb win. Besides Jogendranath Mandal, Baba Saheb got the support of 6 other MLAs - Nagendra Narayan Rai, Mukunda Bihari Mallick, Dwarikanath Baruri, Gayanath Biswas, Kshetrinath Sindha and Birsa and on 20 July 1946, Baba Saheb was declared victorious.

## Baba Saheb were put out of constituent assembly

The joy of Baba Saheb's victory lasted only for a year. On 4 July 1947, the 'Indian Independence Bill'

was presented in the British Parliament, which was passed on 15 July 1947. The partition of India was ensured. With the partition of India, Bengal was also divided into two parts. The Khulna-Jessore seat of Bengal from which Baba Saheb was elected, became a part of Pakistan. Thus Baba

Saheb was put out of the Constituent Assembly of India. The sad part was that in the Khulna-Jessore region, Hindus were 52 percent and Muslims were 4 percent and theoretically it should have been a part of India in the partition, but the Congress Party gave it to Pakistan under its crooked politics. It was the evil policy of Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru to show Baba Saheb the way out of the politics of independent India.

# A TRIBUTE TO ATAL JI, THE STATESMAN WHO SHAPED INDIA WITH HIS VISION AND RESOLVE

oday, 25th December is a very special day for all of us. Our nation marks the 100th Jayanti of our beloved former Prime Minister, Shri Atal Bihari Vajpayee Ji. He stands tall as a statesman who continues to inspire countless people.

Our nation will always be grateful to Atal Ji for being the architect of India's transition into the 21st century. When he took oath as PM in 1998 our nation had passed through a period of political instability. In about 9 years we had seen 4 Lok Sabha elections. The people of India were getting impatient and also sceptical about governments being able to deliver. It was Atal Ji who turned this tide by providing stable and effective governance. Coming from humble roots, he realised the struggles of the common citizen and the transformative power of effective governance.

One can see the long-term impact of Atal Ji's leadership in so many sectors around us. His era marked a gigantic leap in the world of Information Technology, telecom and communications. This was particularly important for a nation like ours, which is also blessed with a very dynamic Yuva Shakti. The NDA Government under Atal Ji made the first serious attempt to

Ji understood Indian Atal democracy and also the need to make it stronger. Atal Ji presided over the creation of the NDA, redefined coalitions in which Indian politics. He brought people together and made NDA a force for development, national progress regional ambitions. and Parliamentary brilliance was seen throughout his political journey. He belonged to a party with a handful of MPs but his words were enough to rattle the might of the all-powerful Congress Party that time. Atal Ji's persona was magnetic and his life was enriched by his love for literature and expression. A prolific writer and poet, he used words to inspire, provoke thought, and even offer solace. His poetry, often reflective of his inner struggles and hopes for the nation, continues to resonate with people across age groups.

For so many Bharatiya Janata Party Karyakartas like me, it is our privilege that we were able to learn and interact with a person like Atal Ji. His contribution to the BJP was foundational. In those days to spearhead an alternative narrative to the dominant Congress showed his greatness. Alongside stalwarts like Shri L.K. Advani Ji and Dr. Murli Manohar Joshi Ji he nurtured the party from its formative years, guiding it through challenges, setbacks and triumphs. Whenever the choice came between ideology and power, he always chose the former. 

the Viceroy's Council from 1942 to 1946 and held the portfolios of Labour and CPWD.

Baba Saheb had already shown his efficiency in the Viceroy Council. His life was full of struggles, he dedicated his life to safeguard the interests of Dalits, backward, tribals and deprived.

Baba Saheb Bhimrao Ambedkar participated in the first Round Table Conference in London in 1930 as a representative of Dalits and backward classes. He strongly presented the problems and interests of Dalits, backward and tribals. His speech in the Round Table Conference of 1930 is considered historic, which was not liked by Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru and senior Congress leaders. Nehru did not want that the representative of Dalits, backward and tribals should participate in the Round Table Conference to expose the evil policies of Congress.

The nation respected Baba Saheb's efficiency and wanted him to be a part of the Constituent Assembly, so that the interests of Dalits, backwards could be protected in the Constitution of India. Under pressure from the people, the Congress Party softened its stubbornness towards Baba Saheb and he was elected to the Indian Constituent Assembly from the Bombay state from the seat vacated by Mukund Ramrao Jankar.

## **Constitution of Drafting Committee**

Dr. Rajendra Prasad was elected the President of the Constituent Assembly. The most important committee among all the committees of the Constituent Assembly was the 'Drafting Committee', which was formed on 29 August 1947. This committee was entrusted with the task of drafting the new constitution. Nehru did not want to see Baba Saheb in the Drafting Committee. Ambedkar's image as a social reformer was a cause of concern for the Congress. This was the reason why the Congress Party had planned to keep him away from the Constituent Assembly, but due to the pressure from several quarters, Baba Saheb was elected in the Constituent Assembly.

Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru wanted to take the help of British experts to write the Constitution, but Mahatma Gandhi said that when a scholar like Dr. Ambedkar is present in India then what is the need of a foreign expert.

Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar was made the chairman of the constitution draft committee. Other members of the committee were N. Madhava Rao, T.T. Krishnamachari, Dr. K.M. Munshi, Syed Mohammad Saadullah, N. Gopalaswami Iyengar, Alladi Krishnaswamy Iyer, B.L. Mitter and D.P. Khaitan.

Two of these members lived abroad and one passed away. The desired cooperation of many members was not received. While signing the Constitution, drafting committee member T.T. Krishnamachari accepted that Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar played a key role in drafting the Constitution.

#### Interim Government of India in 1946

Viceroy Lord Wavell invited Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru to form an interim government in India on 2 September 1946. This interim government consisted of 12 members under the leadership of Pandit Nehru. After the resignation of three members of the Congress, five members of the Muslim League were included, then the total number of members became 14.

Two Dalit ministers were included in the interim government. These members were Babu Jagjivan Ram-Labour Minister and Jogendra Nath Mandal-Law Minister. Mandal was made Minister from Muslim League quota. Again Dr. Ambedkar was ignored in the interim government, the pain of which continued to haunt Baba Saheb. When Baba Saheb resigned from the post of Law Minister of India on 27 September 1951 after 4 years, 1 month and 26 days, he wrote that he was not considered worthy of the post of minister in the interim government of 1946.

## Being a Law Minister of India no administrative work was assigned to Dr Ambedkar

After the independence of the country, a government was formed under the leadership of Pandit Nehru, in which Baba Saheb was made the Law Minister. Baba Saheb wanted to be given an administrative post so that he could do something for the Dalits, backward and deprived. He wrote in his resignation letter that being a member of the Viceroy Council, he knew that the Law Ministry was unimportant from the administrative point of view. He used to call this ministry an empty soapbox which was good only for the old lawyers to play with. He told Prime Minister Nehru that in the Executive Council of the Viceroy Council, he had two administrative departments 'Labour and CPWD' where he had seen many projects, due to which he should also get some administrative departments. The Prime Minister also

agreed that he would give him the 'Planning' department which he was going to create. The Planning Department was formed with a lot of delay and when it was formed, Baba Saheb was ignored there too. During his tenure, the departments of many ministers were changed, many ministers were also given two-three portfolios, but Nehru never considered his name. He was not given a place in the main committees of the cabinet like Foreign Affairs, Defence Committee, Economic Affairs Committee. Baba Saheb was a renowned economist, he was expected to be included in the Economic Affairs Committee, which proved to be a disappointment.

## Nehru neglects Dalits and backward classes

Baba Saheb was saddened by the neglect of Dalits, backward and deprived by the Nehru government. No measures were taken in the Constitution to protect Dalits and backward classes. The interests of these classes were to be protected by the executive government on the basis of the recommendations of a commission to be appointed by the President. Even after more than a year of the Constitution coming into force, the government did not even think of forming a commission. In 1946, when he was not in any post, Dr Ambedkar was very worried about Dalits and backward classes. The Nehru government also dropped out on the promises made by the British regarding constitutional safeguards for the Scheduled Castes. Baba Saheb was not satisfied with the provision made in the Constitution to protect the status of Scheduled Castes. Baba Saheb was saddened by the atrocities on Dalits because there was no improvement in it even after independence. He was very sad that nothing was being done on the issues of Dalits and they were neglected.

## Pandit Nehru was only concerned about Muslims

Baba Saheb was very disturbed about the condition of Dalits and backward people in independent India. In his resignation letter on 10 October 1951, he wrote a bitter truth. He wrote that the entire time and attention of the Prime Minister is devoted to the security of Muslims. Baba Saheb said that he wants that Muslims should be given security whenever and wherever they need it, but are Muslims the only people who need security? Don't the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Indian Christians need security? The Prime Minister did not show any concern for these communities. These

deprived communities of the country need more care than Muslims.

We can say from the free thoughts of Baba Saheb that the Congress Party has been against the Dalits and the backward classes since the beginning.

#### Insult to the Constitution Maker

The Congress party always tried to humiliate Baba Saheb. He had to face neglect throughout his life. Congress used all its power to stop him from entering the Constituent Assembly. When Baba Saheb contested the Lok Sabha elections from Mumbai in 1952, Nehru went to his election twice and protested. Baba Saheb lost the election to his former colleague Kajolkar by 14,374 votes. It is also worth noting that about 78,000 votes were declared invalid in that election. Similarly, Congress again made Baba Saheb lose the Bhandara Lok Sabha by-election in 1954.

Not only this, even after Baba Saheb's Mahaparinirvan, Congress did not allow his picture to be put up in the Central Hall of Parliament, not awarded him with 'Bharat Ratna'. When Vishwanath Pratap Singh became the Prime Minister in 1989 with the support of Bharatiya Janata Party, then on the suggestion of Hon'ble Atal Bihari Vajpayee ji and senior BJP leaders, Baba Saheb was given 'Bharat Ratna' and his portrait was placed in the Central Hall on 14 April1990.

## Efforts of BJP government to honour Baba Saheb

In the year 2014, Shri Narendra Modi became the Prime Minister of India. He initiated 'Panchtirtha' at Janmabhoomi (Mhow, Madhya Pradesh), Shiksha Bhoomi (London), Deeksha Bhoomi (Nagpur), Mahaparinirvan Bhoomi (Delhi), Chaitya Bhoomi (Mumbai). The Congress party governments have only insulted Baba Saheb.

Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi started celebrating 26 November 2015 as 'Constitution Day'. Congress also objected to this. They said that when 26 January is celebrated as Republic Day, then there is no need to celebrate 'Constitution Day' on 26 November. Now by celebrating the Constitution Day, the Constitution maker Bharat Ratna Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar is honored and his contribution in the making of the Constitution is being conveyed to the people.

His vision was ignored, his expertise dismissed, and his presence disregarded. Congress did not just fail to respect him in life, but they continued to disregard his perspectives and legacy long after his death.

One of the most striking examples of Congress's disregard for Ambedkar's vision was their utter failure to help Dalit refugees India, after the partition post-independence. Despite Ambedkar's repeated pleas, the Congress government turned a blind eye towards their suffering. Then there was the Hindu Code Bill, which Ambedkar struggled for to ensure gender equality and improve women's rights. But Congress couldn't get it through, and this abject failure led to Ambedkar resigning from Nehru's cabinet. India's highest civilian honor, during his lifetime, it was only in 1990, under a non-Congress supported government, that he was honored. Even when Congress came in power

again, his legacy continued to be undermined. Dr. Ambedkar himself famously said about the Congress party, 'I have learned to suffer and to endure injustice. But the Congress has been unwilling to accept any part of my vision. It is not my party.'

The Congress party's actions have often confronted Ambedkar's core principles. During the 1975 Emergency, they curbed the basic fundamental rights and debilitated the judiciary through the 42nd Amendment, actions that demolished Ambedkar's vision of a strong & vibrant democracy and freedom of expression. Congress



also blatantly misused Article 356 to dismiss state governments more than 85 times, undermining the federal structure Ambedkar gave his life for.

Congress's was against Article 370 abrogation, which further shows their disconnect from Ambedkar's core idea of unity. While Ambedkar opposed such special provisions, Congress not only implemented Article 370 but resisted its removal ever since. On the social justice front, Congress acted when it suited to them. They deliberately delayed implementing the Mandal Commission's recommendations and were literally half-hearted in pushing it forward.

abasaheb Bhimrao Ramji Ambedkar's towering contribution India's constitutional framework and social justice discourse remains beyond dispute. But for too long, his name and work were relegated to the margins of history. Successive Congress governments paid heed to the very principles of equity and inclusion that Dr. Ambedkar championed. Whereas, the Bharativa Janata Party has stepped forward to restore him to his rightful place in the national consciousness. ensuring that his ideas on social justice continue to guide the nation's policies.

The Congress party's neglect of Dr. Ambedkar reveals a legacy deep-seated indifference. Congress left no stone unturned to stop Dr Ambedkar from entering the constituent assembly, reflecting how Congress deemed Dr. Ambedkar's intellect and social standing peripheral to their own political calculus. This neglect even after persisted India's independence. The regions of Bengal like Barisal and Faridpur in Bengal that had supported Dr. Ambedkar's entry into the Constituent Assembly were later allowed to go to Pakistan—a move that highlighted Congress's willingness to sacrifice regions with significant Dalit population for the sake of electoral convenience.

Time and again, Congress orchestrated strategic alliances to exclude Dr. Ambedkar from electoral politics. The 1952 Lok Sabha elections demonstrated this tactic when Congress leaders,

including S.K. Patil, joined forces with the Communists to defeat him on the instruction of Nehru. The hostility was laid bare yet again in 1954, when the party fielded the same candidate to thwart him in the Bhandara by-election. Even Jawaharlal Nehru personally campaigned against him, exemplifying how Congress was determined to stamp out any genuine challenge to its dominance—especially from a thinker of Dr. Ambedkar's caliber.

Dr. Ambedkar's time as a minister in Nehru's cabinet likewise underscored Congress's reluctance to embrace his vision. Despite being the first Indian to earn a doctorate in economics, he was deliberately kept out of major

decision-making committees on economic policy, defense and foreign affairs. Dr. Ambedkar's resignation forceful was а indictment of the Congress unwillingness leadership's combat entrenched caste barriers and its lack of commitment to robust reforms like the Hindu Code Bill. Worse still, Congress did not even see fit to archive his

resignation letter, signalling its broader intention to erase Dr Ambedkar and his dissent from the official record.

Congress's disregard for Dr. Ambedkar's monumental contributions did not end with his life. Upon his demise in December 1956, the then government's refusal to allow

his cremation in Delhi spoke volumes about its insecurities concerning his enduring popularity among marginalized communities. His family was denied basic courtesies, forced to take his body to Mumbai, without any official assistance. Even more telling was the refusal to allocate a state plane for the journey—Dr. Ambedkar's grieving wife was billed for the flight costs instead.

In the decades that followed, Congress spared no effort in memorializing the Nehru-Gandhi family but repeatedly neglected calls to honour Dr. Ambedkar with an equivalent sense of national gratitude. Memorials dedicated to his memory languished as mere afterthoughts in Congresss



governments. It was only under a non-Congress government supported by the BJP in 1990 that Dr. Ambedkar was posthumously awarded the Bharat Ratna—an honour the Congress had steadfastly withheld.

The BJP, recognizing Dr. Ambedkar's transformative role in shaping India's constitutional ethos, has taken significant strides to reestablish his rightful legacy. Prime Minister Shri Narendra Panchteerth Modi's initiative stands out for its comprehensive scope: it honours five sites linked to Dr. Ambedkar's life and education—his birthplace in Mhow, the site of his studies in London, his conversion Buddhism in Nagpur, Mahaparinivaran sthal Delhi, and Chaitya Bhoomi in Mumbai. By converting these sites into national monuments, the BJP underscores Ambedkar's place guiding luminary in India's journey toward genuine social justice.

Far from beina mere symbolism, these projects represent a commitment to actualize his dream of equity and inclusion. The BHIM app—named to salute Dr. Ambedkar's legacyhighlights the BJP's emphasis on financial inclusion via technology. Similarly, schemes like Stand-Up India and Mudra Yojana echo Dr. Ambedkar's vision of an economy that favors the self-empowerment of the disadvantaged, rather top-down patronage. than The establishment of the Dr. Ambedkar International Centre in Delhi and the preservation of his London residence serve as enduring testimonies to the BJP's dedication to keep his insights accessible for future generations.

Ambedkar's speeches and writings offers an unfiltered view of his deep frustration with Congress's duplicity. He pinpointed the party's reluctance dismantle entrenched hierarchies, accusing Congress leaders of paying lip service to the cause of Dalits while doing little to challenge their systemic criticisms, oppression. His often dismissed as personal grievances, stemmed from

> This ideological rift has persisted into the present day. While Congress occasionally invokes Dr. Ambedkar's name. it comes off as an opportunistic bereft of genuine gesture intent. In contrast, the BJP has pursued a consistent course of integrating Dr. Ambedkar's values into the larger framework of national governance, aligning developmental plans with the principles of social and economic inclusion he championed.

> Perhaps the greatest testament to Dr. Ambedkar's revival lies in the

tangible transformation witnessed under the BJP's stewardship. Where Congress failed to move beyond symbolic posturing, the BJP has placed his ideals of social justice and economic empowerment of marginalised at the heart of policy-making, bridging ideological, regional, and social divides.

By restoring Dr. Ambedkar to his rightful stature, the BJP has corrected a historical wrong. Rather than confine his contributions to perfunctory statues and token tributes, the

party has woven his life's work into the fabric of India's governance. The renewed visibility of his principles—be it in promoting financial inclusion or challenging societal prejudices—attests to a commitment far deeper than mere rhetoric.

## PM MODI INAUGURATES AND LAYS FOUNDATION STONE OF VARIOUS RAILWAY PROJECTS

Charlapalli New Terminal Station in the Medchal-Malkajgiri District of Telangana has been developed as a new coaching terminal along with provision of second entry with a cost of around Rs 413 crore. This environment friendly terminal, having good passenger amenities, will ease congestion on the existing coaching terminals in the city like Secunderabad, Hyderabad and Kacheguda.

The Prime Minister also laid the foundation stone for Rayagada Railway Division Building of East Coast Railway. It will improve connectivity in Odisha, Andhra Pradesh and nearby areas and lead to overall socioeconomic development of the region.

## CABINET APPROVES ADDITION OF FEATURES IN THE PM- FASAL BIMA YOLANA

The fund will be utilised towards funding technological initiatives under the scheme namely, YES-TECH, WINDS, etc as well as Research and Development studies.

- With the help of digital navigation, you will be able to reach different ghats, temples, and akharas of




sadhus. The same navigation system will also help you reach parking spaces.

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
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
