Noteworthy, the Bharatiya Janata Party has secured a historic victory in the 2025 Delhi Legislative Assembly elections, marking its return to power in the national capital after nearly three decades. As the National Vice President of the BJP Mahila Morcha and a former General Secretary of Delhi BJP, she continues to be a prominent leader in Delhi politics. She becomes the fourth woman Chief Minister of

Delhi and the second women BJP CM after Smt. Sushma Swaraj.

He highlighted Al's transformative role in health, education, and agriculture, while advocating investment in workforce skilling.

PM Shri Modi stressed that the world stood at the dawn of the Al age, where technology was reshaping global polity, economy, security, and society. He called for collective efforts to establish Al governance that upholds shared values, addresses risks, and builds trust. He emphasized that governance should not only manage risks but also promote innovation for global benefit, ensuring equitable Al access, especially for the Global South.

Referring to the India-France sustainability partnership, including the International Solar Alliance, PM Shri Modi highlighted the importance of joint innovation efforts. He announced that India will host the next Al Summit, reinforcing its commitment to Al development and regulation.



India's Digital Public Infrastructure and AI Mission

PM Shri Modi highlighted India's success in building Digital Public Infrastructure for 1.4 billion citizens, based on open and accessible technology. He also spoke about India's Al Mission, including efforts to develop its own Large Language Model tailored to its diversity. He reaffirmed India's readiness to share its Al expertise to ensure widespread benefits.

Additionally, the two leaders reviewed the 2047 Horizon Roadmap, reaffirming their commitment to bilateral cooperation in technology, defense, and economic development. Their visit to the ITER nuclear fusion project in Cadarache underscored their shared vision for advancing scientific research and clean energy solutions.

PRIME MINISTER'S SUCCESSFUL VISIT TO THE UNITED STATES

The Prime Minister on 13 February, 2025 concluded a highly substantive and productive visit to the United States at the invitation of President Donald Trump. This marked the Prime Minister's first visit to the U.S. following President Trump's second-term inauguration.

Strengthening U.S.-India Ties: Key Outcomes of the Prime Minister's Washington Visit

During his visit to Washington, D.C., on February 12, the Prime Minister engaged in high-level meetings, including discussions with Director of National Intelligence Tulsi Gabbard and business leaders Elon Musk and Vivek Ramaswamy.

Strategic and Economic Cooperation

Extensive talks at the White House covered defense, trade, technology, and global issues, culminating in the launch of the U.S.-India Compact for the 21st Century to enhance bilateral cooperation.

The leaders unveiled Mission 500, aiming to double two-way trade to \$500 billion by 2030, and committed to negotiating a multi-sector trade agreement by fall 2025. Indian firms pledged over \$7 billion in U.S. investments

Defense and Security

A new 10-year defense partnership (2025-2035) will be finalized, focusing on procurement, co-production, and technology exchange. The U.S. pledged to review arms transfer regulations and streamline defense trade. The Autonomous Systems Industry Alliance was launched to boost collaboration in autonomous defense technologies.

Technology and Innovation

The U.S.-India TRUST Initiative will drive cooperation in AI, semiconductors, quantum computing, and biotechnology. A Strategic Mineral Recovery Initiative was launched to strengthen critical mineral supply chains. The Indus Innovation Bridge will facilitate joint ventures in space and energy. The two sides committed to a U.S.-India AI Roadmap by year-end.

Energy and Climate

The U.S. and India agreed to collaborate on hydrocarbon trade, energy price stability, and nuclear energy, with progress on deploying U.S.-designed nuclear reactors and small modular reactors (SMRs) in India. A new NSF-ANRF partnership will deepen research cooperation in emerging energy technologies.

Education and Mobility

With 300,000 Indian students in the U.S., both sides committed to expanding academic partnerships and encouraging U.S. university campuses in India. Visa processes will be streamlined to facilitate student and professional mobility while enhancing efforts to combat illegal immigration and trafficking.

This visit reinforced the U.S.-India strategic partnership, setting the stage for deeper collaboration in defense, trade, and technology. The two nations will convene partners under IMEC and I2U2 within six months and launch the Indian Ocean Strategic Venture to advance regional connectivity and commerce.

PM Modi releases installment to 9.8 Crore Farmers amounting to more than 22,000 crore

Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi released the 19th instalment of the Pradhan Mantri Kisan Samman Nidhi (PM-KISAN) scheme on 24 February, 2025 in Bhagalpur, Bihar. During the event over 9.8 crore farmers including 2.41 crore female farmers across the country will be benefitted through the 19th instalment release, receiving direct financial assistance exceeding Rs. 22,000 crore through Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) without involvement of any middlemen, reinforcing the Government's commitment to farmer welfare and agricultural prosperity. With this installment, the scheme will be supporting farmers nationwide and further reaffirming the government's commitment to rural development and agricultural prosperity.

Previously, Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi released the 18th instalment of the Pradhan Mantri Kisan Samman Nidhi (PM-KISAN) scheme on 5th October 2024 in Washim, Maharashtra. This significant event witnessed over 9.4 crore farmers across the country receiving direct financial benefits, amounting to more than Rs. 20,000 crore.

he PM-KISAN scheme is a central sector scheme launched in February 2019 by Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi to supplement the financial needs of landholding farmers. Under the scheme, a financial benefit of Rs 6,000/- per year is transferred in three equal instalments, into the Aadhaar seeded bank accounts of farmers through Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) mode.

A farmer-centric digital infrastructure has ensured the benefits of the scheme reach

all the farmers across the country without involvement of any middlemen. Maintaining absolute transparency in registering and verifying beneficiaries, the Government of India has disbursed over Rs 3.46 lakh Cr. in 18 instalments since inception, as of February 2025.

Objectives

With a view to augment the income of the Small and Marginal Farmers (SMFs), the PM-KISAN scheme aims to: Supplement the financial needs of the SMFs in procuring various inputs to ensure proper crop health and appropriate yields, commensurate with the



anticipated farm income at the end of each crop cycle.

This would also protect them from falling in the clutches of moneylenders for meeting such expenses and ensure their continuance in the farming activities.

Technological Advancements

With an objective to make the scheme more efficient, effective, and transparent, continuous improvements in a farmer-centric digital infrastructure have been made to ensure the benefits of the scheme reach all the farmers

across the country without any middleman involvement.

The PM-KISAN mobile app was launched on 24th February 2020. This has been developed with an emphasis on greater transparency and to reach more farmers. The PM-KISAN mobile app servers a simple and efficient extension to the PM-KISAN web portal. In 2023, the app was launched with an additional "Face Authentication Feature". This enabled remote farmers to do e-KYC by scanning their face without OTP or fingerprint.

The portal and mobile app offer services like self-registration, benefit status tracking, and facial

authentication-based e-KYC. Farmers in remote areas can complete e-KYC via face scans, with provisions to assist neighbours.

Over 5 lakh Common Service Centres (CSCs) have been onboarded to facilitate registrations and meet mandatory requirements. Additionally, a robust grievance redressal system was established on the portal, and an Al chatbot, Kisan-eMitra, launched in September 2023, provides instant query resolution in local languages regarding payments, registration, and eligibility. Farmers can also assist 100 other farmers in their neighbourhood to complete e-KYC at their doorstep. In addition, the Government of India has also extended the facility for completing e-KYC of farmers to State Government officials, allowing each official to do e-KYC for 500 farmers.

PM-KISAN AI CHATBOT

In 2023, an Al Chatbot was launched for the PM-KISAN scheme, becoming the first Al chatbot integrated with a major flagship scheme of the Union government. The Al Chatbot provides farmers with prompt, clear, and accurate responses to their queries. It has been developed and improved with the support of EKstep foundation and Bhashini. The introduction of the Al chatbot in the PM-KISAN grievance management system is aimed at empowering farmers with a user-friendly and accessible platform.

The Al Chatbot, accessible through the PM KISAN mobile app, is integrated with Bhashini, which offers multilingual support, catering to the linguistic and regional diversity of the PM KISAN beneficiaries. 'Digital India BHASHINI' seeks to enable easy access to the internet and digital services in Indian languages, including voice-based access, and help the creation of content in Indian languages. This integration of advanced technology will not only enhance transparency but will also empower farmers to make informed decisions.

Additionally, the Department of Posts offers the facility of linking/updating mobile number with Aadhaar for farmers benefiting from PM KISAN scheme. This is to complete e-KYC, through India Post Payment Bank.

Other customer information as available in the passbook which is required for mandate registration.

Impact and Achievements

- Since its inception, the Government of India has disbursed over Rs 3.46 lakh Cr. in 18 installments.
- A significant saturation drive launched in November 2023 under the Viksit Bharat Sankalp Yatra added over 1 crore eligible farmers to the scheme.
- An additional 25 lakh farmers were included within the first 100 days of the subsequent government in June 2024. As a result, the number of beneficiaries receiving the 18th installment increased to 9.59 crore.
- The scheme has a wide reach across various states.
 For instance, during the 18th installment (August 2024 November 2024), Uttar Pradesh had the highest number of beneficiaries at 2,25,78,654, followed by Bihar with 75,81,009 beneficiaries.

A promising journey

An independent study conducted by International Food Policy Research Institute (IFPRI) in 2019, found that PM-KISAN funds boosted rural economic growth, eased farmers' credit constraints, and increased agricultural input investments. Further, the scheme has enhanced farmers' risk-taking capacity, leading them to undertake riskier but comparatively productive investments.

Conclusion

In the last five years, the PM-KISAN Scheme has evolved into a transformative initiative for the farming community, achieving significant milestones in financial inclusion and rural empowerment. Its vision of providing direct and timely assistance to millions of farmers has been implemented with remarkable efficiency. The scheme's seamless digital infrastructure, which enables direct transfers to beneficiaries' accounts, has set a benchmark for transparency and effective governance. As PM-KISAN continues to expand its reach, it stands as a testament to the government's commitment to strengthening the agricultural sector and enhancing the livelihoods of India's farmers.

Government approves Pradhan Mantri Annadata Aay Sanrakshan Abhiyan (PM-AASHA) Scheme till 2025-26

Government to procure 100% of State's Tur, Urad, and Masur Production for Next Four Years

he Government of India on 17 February approved the continuation of the integrated Pradhan Mantri Annadata Aay Sanrakshan Abhiyan (PM-AASHA) Scheme during the 15th Finance Commission Cycle up to 2025-26. The integrated PM-AASHA Scheme is administered to bring-in more effectiveness in the implementation of procurement operations that would not only help in providing remunerative prices to the farmers for their produce but also control the price volatility of essential commodities by ensuring their availability at affordable prices to consumers. Under the Price Support Scheme of the integrated PM-AASHA Scheme, the procurement of the notified Pulses, Oilseeds and Copra conforming to the prescribed Fair Average Quality (FAQ) is undertaken by the Central Nodal Agencies (CNAs) at the MSP directly from the pre-registered farmers through the State level agencies.

In order to incentivize the farmers contributing to enhancement of domestic production of pulses and to



reduce the dependence on imports, the Government has allowed the procurement of Tur, Urad and Masur under PSS equivalent to 100% of the production of the State for the procurement year 2024-25.

The Government has also made an announcement in Budget 2025 that procurement of Tur (Arhar), Urad and Masur up to 100% of the production of the State will be continued for another four years through Central Nodal Agencies to achieve self- sufficiency in pulses in the country.

High Level Committee approves 1554.99 crore of additional Central assistance to five States

The High-Level Committee (HLC), under the Chairmanship of the Union Home minister and Minister of Cooperation Shri Amit Shah on 19 February approved Rs.1554.99 crore of additional Central assistance under the National Disaster Response Fund (NDRF) to five States, affected by flood, flash flood, landslides, cyclonic storm during year 2024. This shows the resolve of the Central Government under the leadership of Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi to help the people of five States who faced these natural disasters.

The HLC approved central assistance of Rs.1554.99 crore to five States from NDRF, subject to an adjustment of 50% of the opening balance for the year available in the SDRF. Out of the total amount of Rs.1554.99 crore, Rs 608.08 crore has been approved for Andhra Pradesh, Rs 170.99 crore

for Nagaland, Rs 255.24 crore for Odisha, Rs. 231.75 crore for Telangana and Rs. 288.93 crore for Tripura.

This additional assistance is over and above the funds released by the Centre to the States in the State Disaster Response Fund (SDRF), already placed at the disposal of the States. During the financial year 2024-25, the Central Government has released Rs. 18,322.80 crore to 27 States in SDRF and Rs. 4,808.30 crore from NDRF to 18 States, Rs. 2208.55 crore from the State Disaster Mitigation Fund (SDMF) to 14 States and Rs. 719.72 crore from National Disaster Mitigation Fund (NDMF) to 08 States.

The Central Government had deputed Inter-Ministerial Central Teams (IMCTs) to these States, immediately after the calamities, without waiting for the receipt of a formal Memorandum.

he Mahakumbh has successfully concluded in the holy city of Prayagraj. A grand Mahayajna of Unity has been completed. When the consciousness of a nation awakens, when it breaks free from the shackles of a centuries-old mindset of subjugation, it breathes freely in the fresh air of renewed energy. The result of this was witnessed at the Ekta Ka Mahakumbh (Mahakumbh of Unity) in Prayagraj since January 13.

On January 22, 2024, during the Pran Pratishtha of the Ram Mandir in Ayodhya, I spoke about Devbhakti and Deshbhakti - devotion to the divine and to the nation. During the Mahakumbh in Prayagraj, Gods and Goddesses, saints, women, children, youth, senior citizens and people from all walks of life came together. We witnessed the awakened consciousness

of the nation. This was Ekta Ka Mahakumbh, where the sentiments of 140 crore Indians converged at the same place, at the same time, for this sacred occasion.

In this holy region of Prayagraj is Shringverpur, a sacred land of unity, harmony and love, where Prabhu Shri Ram and Nishadraj met. Their meeting symbolized the confluence of devotion and goodwill. Even today, Prayagraj inspires us with the same spirit.

For 45 days, I witnessed crores of people from every corner of the country making their way to the Sangam. The wave of emotions at the confluence kept rising. Every devotee came with one purpose – taking a dip in the Sangam. The holy confluence of Ganga, Yamuna, and Saraswati filled every pilgrim with enthusiasm, energy, and confidence.

This Mahakumbh in Prayagraj is a subject of study for modern management professionals, planning, and policy experts. Nowhere in the world is there any parallel or example of this scale.

The world watched in wonder how crores of people gathered

at Prayagraj at the banks of the confluence of rivers. These people had no formal invitations, no prior communication on when to go. Yet crores of people left for the Mahakumbh of their own accord and felt the bliss of taking a dip in the sacred waters.

I cannot forget those faces radiating immense joy and satisfaction after the holy dip. Women, elders, our Divyang brothers and sisters – everyone found a way to reach the Sangam.

It was particularly heartening for me to see the overwhelming participation of India's youth. The presence of the younger generation at the Mahakumbh sends a profound message that the youth of India will be the torchbearers of our glorious culture and heritage. They understand their responsibility towards preserving it and are committed to carrying it forward.

The number of people who arrived in Prayagraj for this Mahakumbh has undoubtedly created new records. But beyond those physically present, crores of people who could not reach Prayagraj were also deeply





connected emotionally to the occasion. The sacred water brought back by pilgrims became a source of spiritual bliss for millions. Many of those returning from the Mahakumbh were received with respect in their villages, honoured by society.

What has happened in the last few weeks is unprecedented and has laid a foundation for centuries to come.

More devotees arrived in Prayagraj than anyone had imagined. The administration had estimated attendance based on past experiences of the Kumbh.

Nearly twice the population of the United States participated in this Ekta Ka Mahakumbh.

If scholars of spirituality analyse the enthusiastic participation of crores of Indians, they will find that India, proud of its heritage, is now surging ahead with a new-found energy. I believe this is the dawn of a new era, which will script the future of a new India.

For thousands of years, the Mahakumbh has strengthened India's national consciousness.

Every Purnakumbh used to witness a gathering of saints, scholars and thinkers deliberating upon the state of society in their times. Their reflections used to provide a new direction to the nation and society. Every six years, during the Ardhkumbh, these ideas were reviewed. After 12 Purnakumbh occurrences spanning 144 years, obsolete traditions were given up, newer ideas were embraced, and new traditions were created to move ahead with times.

After 144 years, in this Mahakumbh, our saints have once again given us a new message for India's development journey. That message is Developed India – Viksit Bharat.

At this Ekta Ka Mahakumbh, every pilgrim, whether rich or poor, young or old, from villages or cities, from India or abroad, from the East or the West, from the North or the South, irrespective of caste, creed and ideology, came together. This was an embodiment of the vision of Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat that filled confidence in crores of people. Now, we must come together in

the same spirit for the mission of building a developed India.

I am reminded of the incident where, as a little boy, Shri Krishna revealed a snapshot of the whole universe within His mouth to His mother Yashoda. Similarly, in this Mahakumbh, the people of India and the world have witnessed the massive potential of India's collective strength. We must now move forward with this self-confidence and dedicate ourselves towards building a developed India.

Earlier, the saints of the Bhakti movement had identified and encouraged the strength of our collective resolve across India. From Swami Vivekananda to Sri Aurobindo, every great thinker reminded us of the power of our collective resolve. Even Mahatma Gandhi experienced it during the freedom movement. Postindependence, if this collective strength had been correctly recognised and harnessed towards boosting the welfare of all, it would have become a great force for a newly independent nation. Unfortunately, it was not done earlier. But now, I am gladdened to witness the way in which this collective strength of the people is coming together for a developed India.

From the Vedas to Vivekananda, from the ancient scriptures to modern satellites, India's great traditions have shaped this nation. As a citizen, I pray that we draw new inspiration from the memories of our ancestors and saints. May this Ekta Ka Mahakumbh help us move ahead with new resolutions. Let us make unity our guiding principle. Let us work with the understanding

that service to the nation is service to the divine.

During my election campaign in Kashi, I had said, "Maa Ganga has called me." This was not just an emotion but also a call of responsibility, towards the

cleanliness of our sacred rivers. Standing at the confluence of the Ganga, Yamuna, and Saraswati in Prayagraj, my resolve became even stronger. The cleanliness of our rivers is deeply linked to our own lives. It is our responsibility to celebrate our rivers, big or small, as life-giving mothers. This Mahakumbh has inspired us to keep working towards the cleanliness of our rivers.

I know that organizing such a massive event was no easy task.

I pray to Maa Ganga, Maa Yamuna, and Maa Saraswati to forgive us in case there were any shortcomings in our devotion. I see Janata Janardan, the people, as an embodiment of divinity. In case there has been any shortcoming in our efforts to serve them, I also seek the forgiveness of the people.

Crores of people came to the Mahakumbh with a feeling of devotion. Serving them was also a responsibility that was carried out with the same feeling of devotion. As a Member of Parliament from Uttar Pradesh, I can proudly say that under the leadership of Yogi Ji, the administration and the people worked together to make this Ekta Ka Mahakumbh a success.

Be it the state or Centre, there were no rulers or administrators and instead, everyone was a devoted sevak. Sanitation workers, police, boatmen, drivers, people serving food - everyone worked tirelessly. The

way the people of Prayagraj welcomed the pilgrims with open hearts despite facing many inconveniences was particularly inspirational. I express my heartfelt gratitude and appreciation to them and the people of Uttar Pradesh.

India's economy is expected to grow by 6.4 per cent in real terms and by 9.7 per cent in nominal terms: FM

While replying to the discussion on the Union Budget 2025-26 in the Lok Sabha, the Minister of Finance and Corporate Affairs, Smt. Nirmala Sitharaman, expressed her gratitude to the Honorable Members for their in-depth discussions in Lok Sabha on on 11 February 2025. She noted that the Budget had been presented amidst significant global uncertainties, shaped by geopolitical tensions such as the Middle East crisis and the Russia-Ukraine conflict, along with stagnation in global GDP and persistent inflation in emerging markets. Despite these difficulties, she emphasized India's economic resilience, citing the first advanced estimates from the National Statistical Office (NSO), which projected a 6.4% growth in real GDP and 9.7% in nominal terms. The synopsis of her speech is as follows:

he Union Minister of Finance and Corporate Affairs, Smt. Nirmala Sitharaman said: the world scenario in the last 10 years has turned almost 180 degrees, as a result of which the challenges for any country in making its budget are far more complicated now than ever before. As per the first advanced estimates from the NSO, India's economy is expected to grow by 6.4 per cent in real terms and by 9.7 per cent in

nominal terms.

The Union Budget 2025-26 has sought to address these immediate challenges facing the domestic economy in the global context. It also rolls out a futuristic path for transforming India into Vikasit Bharat. Our main goals in this Budget are to accelerate growth, secure inclusive development, integrate private-sector investments and uplift household sentiments.

So, with a focus on Garib, youth, Annadata and Naari, the Budget likes to reveal new schemes and reforms in the following broad sectors: promotion of agriculture, MSMEs, investments and exports as growth engines in building rural prosperity and resilience. We also want to have employment-led development spurring domestic consumption and boosting manufacturing in India, including export promotion.

Continuing public capital expenditure and rekindling the animal spirits in the private sector to step up investments, and most importantly, investing in people, investing in the economy and investing for

innovation -- these are actually the points on which the Union Budget is focusing so that we balance the national development priorities with fiscal imperatives. In the Budget of 2025-26, the effective capital expenditure is projected at Rs.15.48 lakh crore as against Rs.13.18 lakh crore in the RE of 2024-25.

It indicates that the Government is using almost

the entire borrowed resources for financing effective capital expenditure. The sectoral outlays in the year 2025-26 include

agriculture and allied activities which get Rs. 1.71 lakh crore; rural development gets Rs. 2.67 lakh crore; urban development and transport, Rs. 6.45 lakh crore; health and education, Rs. 2.27 lakh crore, defence which excludes defence pension, Rs. 4.92 lakh crore. These data from the current

Budget show that capital expenditure outlays have not come down at all. On the

contrary, they have gone up. Across all schemes, the transfer of resources to the States has been growing by the year. In this Budget, it is Rs. 25.01 lakh crore, which is Rs. 2.1 lakh crore more than the previous year. So, the amounts going to the States have not come down at all. India's development story actually presents a stark tale of two opposite approaches to Budget-making and also for fiscal prudence.

The Union budgeting reveals recurrent claims of transparency. The Food Corporation of India has continuously maintained off-budget borrowings. In 2020-

21, the Government took a major step of bringing all the off-budget borrowings of FCI, which totalled Rs.1.2 lakh crore, onto the Budget. So, that enabled better public understanding and discourse on Government debt and also brought a sense of credibility to the Budget documentation itself. That year, we also started to provide the 50-year interest-free loan to the States. From an allocation of Rs.12,000 crore in 2020-21, it has now, in the current Budget, reached Rs.1.50 lakh crore. In 2021-22, the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs' off-budget borrowing was also taken on board. We have taken these initiatives to ensure the Budget's transparency and nothing outside of the Budget will be done.

a proposal which was suggested by the PAC. It will result in substantially enhanced financial delegation to improve operational efficiency in Ministries. This year proactive disclosures, realistic estimation, and ensuring greater predictability are the steps that we have taken. I want to submit here that not only the Centre but also the States will have to look at debt consolidation and also rationalise their debt balances. And therefore, we have outlined a debt consolidation pathway for the Union Government till March, 2031, and this would give some kind of a guidance to the markets with greater predictability also.

Coming to rising unemployment, I want to highlight the fact that according to the 2023-24 Annual Periodic Labour Force Survey, the Labour Force Participation Rate has increased from 49.8 per cent in 2017-18 to 60 per cent in 2023-24, reflecting a rise of about 10.3 percentage points. The Worker Population Ratio has increased from 46.8 per cent in 2017-18 to 58.2 per cent in 2023-24, reflecting a rise of 11.4 percentage points. The unemployment rate has declined from six per cent in 2017-18 to 3.2 per cent in 2023-24. Over 9.25 lakh appointment letters have been issued for the Central Government jobs under Rozgar Mela.

Retail inflation is within notified tolerance

Further, regarding the concerns about high inflation, especially food inflation, I would like to say that it actually receives the highest priority of this Government. Overall retail inflation is within the notified tolerance band of 2-6 per cent. I just want to highlight the fact that food inflation which was affected because of adverse weather conditions or supply chain disruptions has all been attended to. We are still continuing to do it. The water levels in reservoirs are also being monitored. It has improved so that water adequacy for irrigation for Rabi crop production is ensured. As per RBI's latest meeting of the MPC that they held on 7th February, CPI inflation for 2025-26 is projected to lower at 4.2

per cent. During the UPA regime, food inflation reached an even staggering 11 per cent causing severe hardship for the public. Under the NDA regime from 2014-2024, it was brought down to 5.3 per cent indicating a robust focus

on supply chain improvements and agricultural reforms. Fuel inflation under UPA-II was 8.9 per cent compared to NDA 2014-2024 which is at 4.4 per cent highlighting better management of global price volatility under NDA. Total domestic active LPG customers have more than doubled from 14.52 crore in April, 2014 to 32.89 crore as of December, 2024. Under the PM Ujjwala Yojana, the refill rate is per capita consumption is 4.4 cylinders in a year. In this Budget, the Government has taken steps to ensure better productivity in agriculture, so that the supply-side problems can be better administered. PM Dhan Dhanya Krishi Yojana Developing Agricultural Districts Programme is a very important one where a hundred lowproductivity agricultural districts are being focussed. There are other points like the decline in household savings and an increase in household debt. I want to say some facts in this regard. The household savings consist of net financial plus physical savings, increased by a compound average growth rate of 8.9 per cent CAGR from 2019-20 to 2022-23. There is a reallocation of savings by households to real assets. In the post-COVID period, household real estate investments have increased considerably. The share of savings in physical assets in gross household savings has steadily increased from 30.8 per cent in 2015-16 to 42.7 per cent in 2022-23. So, according to the National

Health, education and, social welfare

Public spending outlays in health, education, social welfare, and rural development have increased from Rs. 4.16 lakh crore to 5.54 lakh crore between 2020-21 to 2025-2026. So, there is no cut in any of these. Fiscal consolidation was another issue on which it was being asked whether it is being done at the cost of public spending and social sector spending. It was said that the education budget has been reduced, and the budget for PM POSHAN, Jal Jeevan Mission, PM Awas Yojana, and Post Matric Scholarships have come down. With respect to social welfare, the budget has increased from Rs. 56,501 crore in 2024- 2025 to Rs. 60,052 crore in 2025-2026. It has not gone down. Coming to education, the budget has increased from Rs. 1.26 lakh crore in 2024-2025 to Rs. 1.29 lakh crore in 2025-2026.

Talking about health, the budget which was Rs. 89,287 crore in 2024-2025 has gone to Rs. 98,311 crore in 2025-2026. I would like to highlight one point at this time. The technology which has been adopted for Budget and Budget management has today given all of us the advantage of getting facts by looking at the portal or by looking at the documents. please refer to the Expenditure Profile Statement.

The next head is Samagra Siksha. An amount of Rs.11,516 crore is lying there in the States. An amount of Rs. 5,205 crore is lying in the State accounts, and

this is for Poshan Abhiyan. Under the Flexible Pool for RCH health system, strengthening the National Health Program and the National Urban Health Mission, an amount of Rs.2,988 crore lying with the States. Under Human Resources for Health and Medical Education, an amount of Rs.7,059 crore is lying in the State account.

An amount of Rs. 12,319 crore is left with the States in the Swachh Bharat Mission – Urban. For the Urban Rejuvenation Mission which was launched in 500 cities, an amount of Rs. 12,377 crore is lying with the States. On Jal Jeevan Mission, an amount of Rs. 13,782 crore is lying with the States. These are the funds lying unused on the part of the states. I have already mentioned that the amount of capital expenditure, being given, is increasing steadily every year.

Micro-enterprises

With regard to micro-enterprises I would like to highlight the fact that currently, its allocation is Rs. 1 crore and the revised one is Rs. 2.5 crore. The current turnover of micro-enterprises is Rs. 5 crore and we have revised it to Rs. 10 crore. For small enterprises, the current investment is Rs. 10 crore, and now, we have revised it to Rs. 25 crore, and likewise, the current turnover is Rs. 50 crore and we have revised it to Rs. 100 crore. Similarly, for medium enterprises, we have revised it from Rs. 50 crore to 125 crore, and for turnover, we have revised it from Rs. 250 crore to 500 crore. The loan per capita ceiling of KCC has since been increased from Rs. 3 lakh to 5 Lakh lest they should be compelled to borrow from the middleman. That is the intention with which we have brought in the KCC. Nearly, eight crore farmers will be benefiting from this short-term lending which will begin from 1st April 2025.

Three years prior to 2024-25, the country's GDP growth rate averaged at about eight per cent. Only in two out of last twelve quarters, has the growth rate touched 5.4 per cent or remained below it. On account of a strong economic foundation, a speedy rebound is happening and we shall take measures which will going forward help in keeping our economy growing fastest as in the last few years. We will continue to remain the fastest-growing economy. Private final consumption expenditure is expected to grow by 7.3 per cent in 2024-25 driven by good rural demand. With these words, I would like to thank all the hon. Members who have participated in the Budget Discussion.

 - Support for state-led infrastructure development, ensuring fair allocations across political lines.

SUPPORT TO MSMES AND ECONOMIC REFORMS

INDIA-QATAR STRENGTHEN BILATERAL TIES WITH STRATEGIC PARTNERSHIP AGREEMENT

t the invitation of Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi, Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad Al-Thani, the Amir of Qatar, paid a State Visit to India on February 17-18, 2025. Accompanied by a high-level delegation of ministers, officials, and business leaders, this was the Amir's second State Visit to India

Bilateral talks between Prime Minister Modi and the Amir at Hyderabad House on February 18 focused on strengthening investment, trade. security, and cultural ties. Both leaders expressed satisfaction over signing the 'Agreement on the Establishment of Bilateral Strategic Partnership' and the revised Double Taxation Avoidance Agreement.

They also agreed to expedite negotiations on the India-Qatar Bilateral Investment Treaty.

India and Qatar reaffirmed their commitment to enhancing cooperation across political, economic, and cultural spheres. They welcomed the elevation of the Joint Working Group on Trade and Commerce into a Joint Commission on Trade and Commerce, to be headed by both countries' Commerce Ministers. The leaders set a target to double bilateral trade by 2030 and explored the possibility of a Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement.

The Indian side welcomed the decision of Qatar Investment Authority (QIA) to open an office in India, recognizing India's rapid economic growth. The Joint Task Force on Investments, established in June 2024, was acknowledged for advancing discussions on various investment opportunities. Qatar expressed interest in investing in sectors such as infrastructure,


