
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## Corruption main obstacle in development of our country

# L K Advani begins 38-day 'Jan Chetna Yatra' from Sitabdiara

# 'Rath Yatra' would put pressure on UPA to retrieve black money, pursue good governance & clean politics : Advani





BIP Parliamentary Party Chairman and former Deputy Prime Minister Shri L K Advani began his 38-day Jan Chetna Yatra for good governance and clean politics from the birth place of Loknayak Jay Prakash Narayan in Sitabdiara, Bihar on October 11, 2011, which was flagged off by Bihar Chief Minister Shri Nitish Kumar to take on the Congress led UPA government on the issue of corruption and press for bringing back black money stashed away abroad.

# 'In 1990 a Bihar CM arrested me; in 2011, another flags off my yatra': LK Advani

BJP Parliamentary party chairman and former Deputy Prime Minister Shri Lal Krishna Advani's Jan Chetna Yatra for good governance and clean politics kicked off from Chhapra district on October 11, 2011 afternoon. The campaign was flagged off



by Bihar Chief Minister Shri Nitish Kumar, amid boisterous cheers of the huge crowd that turned in for the event despite enervating heat.

On entering the State capital thousands of people and leaders welcomed the *Yatra* of Shri Advani. The atmosphere was energized with slogans. At both the sides of the road lacs of lotus flags flutter under the Patna sky. People waving and cheering Shri Advani and other leaders atop the modified chariot. 'For an 83-year-old man embarking on his sixth *rath yatra* this is not an easy choice keeping in mind the physical and mental stamina it requires' was the general talking point of the common people in Patna city at that time

Later the *rath* entered the rally ground. Addressing a huge gathering at the public meeting



Shri Advani heaped praise on the Bihar Chief Minister Shri Nitish Kumar for his good governance in Bihar. He said, "If you have a good capable leader, he can do wonders, and that is exactly what Shri Nitish Kumar has done to Bihar. He has brought about the much-needed change in Bihar, displaying courage and perspective needed for running the government so efficiently," he said.

Coming down heavily on the UPA government at the Centre, he said, "UPA's inability to deliver has forced people to lose their faith in the political system." "People are angry due to inflation and corruption," he said.

Shri Advani, who has started his *yatra* on the 109th birth anniversary of Loknayak Jay Prakash Narayan, said, "The government has been shying away from releasing the names who have money

in tax havens abroad because names of important people are on that list. Even the Enforcement Directorate has information about it. The Income-Tax Department has been asked to conduct a silent investigation." He demanded a white paper on the steps taken from the government to tackle the menace of black money.

"Money power and criminalisation in polls are biggest challenges for electoral reforms. We did some reforms when we were in power but lots remain to be done," Shri Advani said.

It is noteworthy that, Shri Advani was arrested in Bihar; 21 years ago during his Somnath to Ayodhya *Yatra* at the behest of then chief minister Lalu Prasad Yadav, something which he sought to recall. "I still remember how I was stopped at Samastipur and subsequently taken to Masanjor. Call it sheer irony that today the Chief Minister of the same State has come to flag off my *yatra*. What a change it has been," he remarked.

Addressing the rally Bihar CM Shri Nitish Kumar however hit back at Lalu Prasad and said some people were scared about Advaniji's *rath yatra* against corruption and was mouthing baseless stuff. "It was JP who had given a clarion call to launch an agitation against corruption in 1974 from Bihar. So now when Advaniji decided to embark on *Jan Chetna Yatra* from Bihar for creating awareness against corruption, I chose to welcome him by flagging of his *rath*. But some people are in the habit of finding fault with everything. How can a *yatra* against corruption be

communal? Why are they scared of any move which will help weed out corruption from society," Shri Kumar asked.

# Loss of faith in Govt. not a good sign for nation: Advani

BJP Parliamentary party chairman and former Deputy Prime Minister Shri Lal Krishna Advani said that people's loss of faith in government was not a good sign for the future of the nation and he was taking out the *Jan Chetna Yatra* to bring self-confidence among the masses. Shri Advani addressed his second biggest public meeting



during the *Jan Chetna Yatra* in Varanasi, UP on the third day of his ongoing *yatra*, after the one at Mughalsarai, and was happy to see the enthusiastic response from the people.

While addressing a huge public meeting at Bharat Mata Mandir premises Shri Advani said, "This *yatra* is not for me or my party but for the people who are frustrated by the growing menace of corruption. When scam after scam, including 2G Spectrum, Mumbai Defence (Adarsh Society), Commonwealth Games etc. were disclosed by the courts, the PAC and the CAG, the people became frustrated as they felt that there was no existence of any government at the Centre".

"It is my sixth *yatra*. I had never received such great response from the people in any of the last five *yatras*. Right from Loknayak Jay Prakash Narayan's birthplace Sitabdiara, from where the *yatra* was flagged off, to Patna via Chapra, I was surprised to see people lined up at the roadsides, literally forming human chains," he said.

Expressing concern over corruption rampant in the country, he said he was taking out the *yatra* 



to mobilise people against it and for bringing back the nation's huge black money stashed in foreign banks.

He said he had pledged to fight corruption to rebuild the nation. "Bhrashtachar mitayenge, naya Bharat banayenge," he said pointing to the slogan of the *yatra*.

Shri Advani said the main cause of price rise was corruption and if it was checked, the country would be in position to provide pure drinking water, power, roads, schools and other infrastructure in all of its six lakh villages. "We cannot build a new India until we check corruption and we cannot make it great until we make Uttar Pradesh corruption-free," he said, adding that UP was the biggest State in the country and population-wise it would be sixth in the world if treated as a country.

Striking a chord with the local populace, Shri Advani said he had emotional attachment with Kashi and Mughalsarai. "My ideal was Pt Deen Dayal Upadhyay and Mughalsarai was his 'punyasthali' (place of death) as he was found death there in mysterious circumstances. When our family shifted from my birth-place Karachi (Sindh, Pakistan) during partition, my father wanted to go to Kutch in Gujarat but we migrated to Kashi on the request of my grandmother, who was 80, as she wanted to pass her last days in this holy city. I spent four years in the city before our family shifted to Kutch," the veteran leader said.

The figure was also authenticated by the Swiss Bank Association.

Shri Advani said that there are many countries including the United States, Germany, France and Russia whose residents have deposited money in tax havens like Switzerland but Indians have stashed away the maximum amount of money.

Referring to the cash-for-vote scam, he said that although three BJP members played the role of whistleblower in the matter, they



were put in Tihar jail. This is also one of the reasons behind the *yatra* as those who had given the money were roaming scot free, he said.

He also sought to know from the Congress led Centre what steps the Government had taken to identify these persons after Switzerland enacted the Restitution of Illicit Assets Act. "I demand the Government bring out a white paper on the issue in the Winter Session of Parliament," he said.

Earlier, addressing the meeting, Leader of Opposition in Lok Sabha Smt. Sushma Swaraj said that even in these days of television watching, a *yatra* served a great purpose. She said that people may not watch television but when a *yatra* passes through their area they come out to have a glimpse of the leader and even listen to his message.

Shri Advani who was on the Maharashtra-leg of his all-India *yatra* against corruption, said the by-poll results were significant. For the UPA government, "the writing is on the wall". The Congress lost the Hisar parliamentary by-election in Haryana that went to Kuldeep Singh Bishnoi of the Haryana Janhit Congress, backed by BJP. It was also defeated in the three other assembly by-elections in Bihar, Andhra Pradesh and Maharashtra.

At a public meeting in Saoner town near Nagpur, Shri Advani had contended that Manmohan Singh was the "weakest" prime minister he had ever seen. Shri Advani felt that calling Singh weak was not an abuse. "When I criticised him by calling him 'weak' before the 2009 elections, people asked me why I said that because he was a good and honest man. Calling him weak is not an abuse. But if the Prime Minister thinks that he cannot do anything till 10 Janpath gives its clearance, it does not behove him," he

said.

On reaching Nagpur, the senior BJP leader reminded the Congress led UPA Government about its inaction on the issue of black money. Referring to Manmohan Singh's recent comments on the Right to Information Act, he said the whole country knew that the RTI brought transparency in the system and even brought the differences between two important Cabinet Ministers (Pranab Mukherjee and P Chidambaram) before the public.

Shri Advani said that in the first seven days of his *yatra* he felt that the response of the people was increasing which gave him the feeling that he was riding a "rollercoaster" that was gaining momentum.

Apart from BJP National president Shri Nitin Gadkari, former BJP President Shri M. Venkaiah Naidu and BJP Deputy leader in the Lok Sabha Shri Gopinath Munde came to Madhya Pradesh-Maharashtra border to receive Shri Advani's yatra. Madhya Pradesh Chief Minister Shri Shivraj Singh Chouhan accompanied Shri Advani to see him off on the border. He entered Adilabad in Andhra Pradesh on October 18 and was scheduled to reach western Maharashtra and Mumbai in the first week of November.

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# BJP to have no truck with BSP: Swaraj

# Law & order all time low in UP: Kalraj



n the presence of BJP Parliamentary Party Chairman Shri Lal Krishna Advani and former LBJP National President Dr. Murli Manohar Joshi, party National vice-president Shri Kalraj Mishra embarked on his *Jan Swabhiman Yatra* from Varanasi at a function in Bharat Mata Mandir. Varanasi, Uttar Pradesh. Shri LK Advani reached the function venue on his ongoing Jan Chetna Yatra rath and the congregation was addressed by BJP's top national and state leaders. Later, both the yatras left the temple city simultaneously for Hanumana in Sonbhadra district from where they were to take separate routes with Advani entering Madhya Pradesh. Shri Mishra said corruption has plagued all

health schemes resulting in the murder of two CMOs in Lucknow and a Deputy CMO in judicial custody. Hundreds of people afflicted by Japanese encephalitis in Gorakhpur, Deoria, Basti and other districts are dying for want of proper treatment. The government, however, appears too obsessed with its own 'business'.

The BJP national vice-president said if BJP came to power in the next Assembly elections, it would provide basic amenities to people as it had done in the past. "The BJP will not only take effective measures to check corruption but also improve and ensure infrastructural facilities in rural and urban areas," he promised. Shri Mishra highlighted the glorious history of Bharat Mata Mandir built in 1936 saying that it was the only temple in the country to depict the picture of Akhand Bharat.



# Tide is turning in favour of NDA: Arun Jaitley

A person with deep roots the Leader of Opposition in Rajya Sabha, Shri Arun Jaitley, made his debut in politics through ABVP and was elected as President of Delhi University Students Union. A veteran of many a political, electoral and legal battles, he is a great speaker with great oratorical and debating skills. He has also been BJP national general secretary and party spokesperson. He also served as Law Minister in Shri Atal Bihari Vajpayee's NDA government.

National Convener of BJP Literature & Publication Cell, Amba Charan Vashishth spoke to him at his residence in New Delhi last fortnight. Excerpts of his interview:



In two years of your functioning as Leader of Opposition in Rajya Sabha, how satisfied are you with the performance of your party in the House?

Personally I am quite satisfied. But it is for others to observe. I am happy to say that almost every MP of my Party has made a contribution by participating in the discussions and raising the issues of vital public importance. The overall performance of the entire Opposition in the Rajya Sabha has also been commendable.

The two Houses of Parliament on August 27, 2011 unanimously adopted a resolution or the sense of the House, whatever it may be called. Has it has paved the way for a smooth passage in Parliament of a strong Lokpal Bill of Shri Anna Hazare's perception?

The Parliament did adopt a resolution and it should pave the way for an effective Lokpal Bill. It is for the UPA to come out with its draft of the Bill with the recommendations of the Standing Committee. Congress somehow or the other appears to be trying to wriggle out of its commitment for a strong Lokpal Bill. Much will depend on the type of Bill the government comes out before the House.

Congress is trying to belittle Anna Hazare's crusade against corruption for a strong Lokpal Bill by imputing BJP and RSS hand behind

the movement. How do you view the situation?

BJP or RSS are only supporting the spirit of the movement against corruption. The movement is purely a Civil Society's movement and it is led by Shri Hazare. It would be improper for the Congress to allege that it is controlled by BJP or RSS.

The investigating agency in the 2008 cash-forvote scam appears to have turned the tables on BJP whose MPs and Shri Sudheendra Kulkarni were the whistleblowers. How has it happened?

The investigation in the cash-for-votes scam is completely faulty. The MPs and Shri Sudheendra Kulkarni were whistleblowers. Once the investigation has established that bribes were indeed paid and no case has been primarily made out, it is incorrect then to involve whistleblowers in a conspiracy to pay bribes. The intention of the whistleblowers was to expose the bribery and not to participate in it.

The last winter session of Parliament got washed out because of the intransigence of UPA to meet the Opposition demand for a JPC on 2G spectrum issue. Too frequently there are occasions of stand-off between government and the Opposition in Parliament on various issues. What should, in your view, be done to ensure that such instances do not get repeated



#### in future?

- The history has vindicated the Opposition. The winter session of 2010 was washed off because of serious allegations and demand for constitution of a JPC. All the disclosures that have come after 2010 have clearly established that there were cases of criminal misconduct for which charge-sheets have been filed and several people are in jail. Had it not been the Opposition pressure during that session, none of this would have happened.
- The PAC and the JPC were the forums which had hitherto functioned in a non-political fashion concentrating on merits and national interest involved in each case. But now it appears this spirit has started evaporating. If political and electoral considerations overweigh with the MPs overlooking merit and national interest involved, is this situation not detrimental to the strengthening of parliamentary democracy?.
- I think the distinction in the functioning of PAC and JPC is getting obliterated because the Congress wants to obstruct the proceedings of the two Committees. It does not want the two committees to give an objective finding, but do a cover-up.
- There has been lot of talk, particularly by the Prime Minister complaining of judicial "overreach". How do you see the present situation in which judiciary has had to intervene in a number of matters where otherwise the executive should have acted on its own?
- Judicial overreach should be avoided. Judicial activism and judicial restraint are two sides of the same coin. Activism can extend only to directing executive to perform its functions. It does not extend to the judiciary usurping the functions of executive to itself.
- Are you satisfied with steps taken by the UPA government to bring back the illegal money stashed by Indians in foreign banks?
- I am not at all satisfied with the steps taken by UPA government to bring back the financial assets stashed by Indians in foreign bank accounts abroad and to monitor progress. In fact government has not taken proactive steps which several other developed countries have taken.

<u>In scandals, like the JMM</u> bribery case, the so far November 1-15, 2011 **Q** 22

- not coded parliamentary privileges seem to have come in the way of dispensing justice to the wrongdoers. Parliament cannot be allowed to be turned into a den of corruption and crime behind the curtain of these privileges. How should such a situation be remedied?
- I am not so pessimistic about the fact that in the absence of codification of the privileges parliament becomes a den of corruption. After all even without the codification of the privileges, there are several cases, like cashfor-questions, where Parliament has taken action against people.
- A new phenomenon has emerged under UPA where if a person hurls accusations of corruption against Congress ministers and leaders, the person and the party instead of trying to prove their own innocence, hit back by trying to paint their accusers more corrupt than the person accused. How do you react to this phenomenon?
- Two wrongs do not make one right. Merely making counter-allegations does not make you clean. We should be able to rout out corruption wherever it is found irrespective of the party where it is found.
- Union Law Minister Salman Khurshid has challenged BJP to block the passing of the Prevention of Communal Violence Bill if it can. What do you say?
- I don't think any chief minister or any sensible person with some political vision is willing to support this Bill. It is going to demolish the very federal structure of the Constitution. It is highly discriminatory. It depends upon the birthmark of the offender whether any offence is made out or not.
- In democracies like USA and UK, law-makers act according to their conscience to safeguard the interests of the nation on national issues, like fight against terrorism, against corruption and black money. They do not look up to their political bosses for a nod how to act or what to speak on the issue. Why is it not so in India?
- UK particularly has had a political switchover when there were defections in their system but it has never affected the morality of British politics. In India defections did impact the morality of politics and therefore it was felt



- necessary to ban defections and a defection law had to be formulated to ensure that whips are not defied in the house.
- Till the bursting out of the 2G spectrum scam Prime Minister Dr. Manmohan Singh had been viewed as a 'clean' person. With fingers now being raised on Home Minister P. Chidambaram and A Raja trying to claim that everything was done with PM's knowledge, has it not affected PM's image?
- The Prime Minister is a weak leader. He has been making compromises in order to continue in power. The effect of this has been that even though he personally claims to be clean, yet he heads one of the most dishonest governments in the history.
- If P. Chidambaram has to resign under Supreme Court pressure, do you think the Manmohan government will totter and elections to five State assemblies could also see mid-term poll for Lok Sabha?
- I do not know what Supreme Court would say in the case of Shri Chidamabaram. But prima facie it appears that he had agreed with Raja's

proposal about the allotment of spectrum in 2008 and 2010.

# What, in your view, would be the outcome in the mid-term poll in Lok Sabha?

- I think if elections are held today, the Congress will be on the back foot. It is on the defensive. Its image has been badly tarnished. There is a serious crisis of credibility and a crisis of leadership in the UPA.
- With reports of UPA graph considerably down and that of BJP-led NDA going up, the media has started speculating about NDA's prime ministerial candidate. Have you anything to say?
- Obviously we are living in a two alliance system. If the UPA goes down the NDA benefits. As it is, the activities of BJP have substantially improved and the atmosphere in the party is much better. Therefore, people are speculating about what would happen if the NDA comes to power. But it is too early to speak who the prime ministerial candidate would be. We shall decide at the appropriate time and decide in a proper democratic process.


# BJP condemns killing of farmers in Police Firing in Assam

# SI presents e-Ratna award to Gujarat Chief Minister



Gujarat initiates pilot projects in 19 technical modules in e-Energy, to announce success stories soon

ujarat Chief Minister Narendra Modi on October 17 in Gandhi Nagar called for the use of e-Energy projects for qualitative improvement in power generation, transmission and distribution with the application of Information-Communication Technology (ICT).

Inaugurating the 8th international conference on e-Governance jointly organized by Communication Society of India (CSI) and Gujarat Government at Nirma University, he defined e-governance as easy-effective-economic governance with a view to applying the technology in everyday life for the welfare of the common man.

Gujarat has laid an ICT network to redress people's grievances down to the village level.

The Chief Minister was presented with the e-Ratna Award of CSI at the function. Explaining the details of e-Energy projects in Gujarat, he said that all the 18,000-odd villages in the State is connected with three-phase electricity supply for 24-hour under *Jyotigram Yojna*, with separate lines for agricultural and domestic consumption.

The Chief Minister said that pilot projects have already been started in developing 19 different technical modules for improving all round efficiency in the cost of producing and revenue, checking theft in different sources of energy, with the synergy between research and technology.

The results would be announced in the coming months as and when each becomes a success. As to how Gujarat remains untouched by severe coal shortage stalking the country, he said, it is because the plant load factor in coal-fired thermal plants has been increased from 60-65 to 85, with the application of technology, stringent monitoring of the inventory and each process of production.

Computers are not just like

flower vases on desktops at government offices but are there to help the people.

He said the need is to create computer literacy as a powerful tool. It has been deployed in computerization of RTO, check posts in remote areas, increasing the state's revenue by Rs.400-crore.

The success of 108-Emergency Service, faster than that in America or Europe, is because of its link with communication technology. He listed GSWAN solving 1.85-lakh problems out of 2-lakh raised by the public, forensic science, crime detection, investigation and punishment, wildlife protection, BRTS in Ahmedabad as some of the other applications. # BJP wants CBI inquiry: Kirit Somaiya

ow in October 2011, Pranab Mukherjee-Finance Ministry accepted Vodafone-Hutchison deal of 2007 is a "Fraud". Once again Chidambaram and Pranab Mukherjee have contradicted each other. This time it is Vodafone Telecom Scam of Rs. 14,000 Crores.

Dr. Kirit Somaiya, BJP National Secretary & Chairman Scam Expose Committee, released various documents of 2007 to October 2011 of Congress Government's Vodafone Scam. It is shocking, in spite of strong objections of Finance Ministry, Shri Chidambaram, then Finance Minister authenticated

the fraudulent Vodafone-Hutchison deal. In his own 2 paragraph notes of 04th

May 2007 Shri Chidambaram set aside Finance Ministry' objections and supported Vodafone-Hutchison – a scam of Rs.14,000 crores.

In its Affidavit filed before the Supreme Court in September, 2011, the Finance Ministry has acknowledged that Vodafone International had misrepresented facts, manipulated Indian laws and violated FIPB and TRAI Norms, Telecom guidelines in its deal to acquire stake in HEL in India. Surprisingly in 2007 the then Finance Minister Shri P. Chidambaram had taken an

exactly opposite stand. Shri Chidambaram's decision not only encouraged Vodafone to violate FDI guidelines regarding sectoral cap of FDI investment in Telecom but also evaded up to Rs.14,000 Crores taxation dues under Indian laws.

This is another incident where Shri Pranab Mukherjee

and Shri Chidambaram crossed each other, said Dr Kirit Somaiya. This has encouraged and supported Vodafone–Hutchison to Pocket Rs.14,000 Crores. The matter is in final phase in the Supreme Court.

#### Solicitor General, Shri Rohinton Nariman, says – "Vodafone-Hutchison transaction is BOGUS"

In October 2011 while arguing the case on behalf of Government of India, Solicitor General, Shri Rohinton Nariman says that the entire corporate structure of erstwhile Hutchison Group's investment was bogus.

Shri Nariman further added that Vodafone-Hutchison sale of shares through investment companies via Cayman Islands was nothing but an artificial tax avoidance scheme. The solicitor General argued that the 20 percent stake in HEL held by Shri Analjit Singh and Shri Asim Ghosh was controlled by HTIL through framework agreements. Shri Nariman further added that over 18,500 companies were registered at the same address as that of CGP the Vodafone Hutchison group Co.

Pranab Mukherjee's Finance Ministry now says Vodafone is 'Fraud'.

# Finance Ministry's strong objection in 2007

The officials in the Finance Ministry have taken the same view when Vodafone-Hutchison submitted their proposal to Ministry of Finance in October 2007. The matter went up for examination in the Foreign Trade



Division of Ministry of Finance, whereby it was noted under the signature of Shri P. K. Bagga, on 20.04.2007, that "the representatives of HEL could not give satisfactory reply to the specific queries raised by the Board".

Shri Anup K. Pujari, the then Joint Secretary, FT Division, MoF, on 26.04.2007 noted "the clear intention was that Analjit Singh and Asim Ghosh Group of Companies are holding the shares in their name only to circumvent the sectoral limits imposed on FDI."

# **Chidambaram Overruled Finance Ministry Objection**

Despite the above two notings clearly establishing the fact that the transaction was violative in all respects, Shri P. Chidambaram, the then Finance Minister, in his notings on 04.05.2007, approved the transaction and supported Vodafone. He stated the same in following words:

"The AG Group, AS Group, and SMMS, shall each separately undertake that notwithstanding any agreement it may have entered into with any other party, it will not transfer to any foreign entity its financial and economic holding and interest without the prior consent of the Government, which consent shall not be withheld if the proposed transfer is compliant with Press Note No.3 of 2007 as may be modified from time to time"

The interpretation was done in a favourable manner of all the applicable clauses to deliberately approve the transaction.

Explaining these facts Dr. Kirit Somaiya, has demanded that the Finance Ministry and the PMO should probe the role played by Shri P. Chidambaram as Finance Minister in overruling his Ministry's opinion and sanctioning Vodafone's acquisition of stake in HEL, which caused blatant violation of FDI norms and led to subsequent evasion of taxes worth Rs.14000 crore.

# Hisar voted against corruption, Congress: BJP

People's anger against corruption had led to the Congress loss in the Hisar Lok Sabha by-election in Haryana, the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) said on October 17,2011.

The Congress lost the Hisar by-election to Kuldeep Singh Bishnoi of the Haryana Janhit Congress (HJC), an alliance partner of the BJP. While the Indian National Lok Dal came second, the state's ruling Congress finished third in the election.

BJP President Shri Nitin Gadkari said that the by-polls results prove people's dissatisfaction against the ruling government.

"Not only Hissar (in Haryana) and Khadakwasla (in Maharashtra), the polls that have taken place across the country have made one thing clear that the public opinion is against the Congress. The various corruption scams including the 2-G spectrum scam and the people who are distressed with inflation and the way the government is functioning, the masses have a major dissatisfaction against it and this has been represented through the by-polls (results)," Gadkari told media persons in Nagpur.

"This is a victory of democracy...It also indicates which way the political wind is blowing in the country," he said.

Leader of Opposition in the Lok Sabha Smt. Sushma Swaraj, thanked the people of Haryana and said their alliance with the HJC would continue.

"Thanks to people of Haryana particularly the electorate of Hissar for supporting the BJP-HJC alliance and electing their joint candidate Shri Kuldeep Bishnoi," Smt. Swaraj tweeted.

"The BJP-HJC alliance will continue in future also," she said.

BJP's Lok Sabha MP Murli Manohar Joshi told reporters that it was a victory of democracy.

"The by-election results show that the people of India have voted against corruption and the Congress," Shri Joshi said.

The Hisar seat fell vacant in June following the death of three-time chief minister Bhajan Lal, Bishnoi's father.

# BJP wins Maharashtra assembly by-election

The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP)-Shiv Sena-Republican Party of India (RPI) alliance registered its first electoral success in the state with the victory of Shri Bhimrao Tapkir in the Khadakwasla assembly by-election, the results of which were declared on October 17,2011. Shri Tapkir won 59,634 votes and defeated his nearest rival, the official Nationalist Congress Party (NCP)-Congress candidate, Harshada Wanjale, by a margin of 3,625 votes. The death of Maharashtra Navnirman Sena (MNS) MLA, Ramesh Wanjale, in June had brought about the by-poll, which was marked by high profile campaigning by both alliances.

# NDA wins Siwan By-poll in Bihar

Bihar's ruling NDA retained the Darounda assembly seat in Siwan district in the by-poll with Kavita Singh winning the seat. She defeated on October 17,2011 Parmeshwar Singh of the Rashtriya Janata Dal (RJD) by over 20,000 votes. Poll was held on October 13 after JD-U MLA Jagmato Devi died. Kavita Singh is the daughter-in-law of the late legislator.

# BJP supported TRS wins Banswada with huge margin

The Telangana Rashtra Samithi (TRS) on October 19 won the by-election to the Banswada Assembly seat in Andhra Pradesh with a huge margin of nearly 50,000 votes. TRS candidate P Srinivas Reddy wrested the seat from the Telugu Desam Party (TDP), which did not contest in view of the strong Telangana sentiments in the region. Over 77 percent of 1.60 lakh eligible voters had voted in the by-election on October 13.

The scam during the last five years of Congress Government is of Rs 22,000 to Rs 25,000 crore, about 15 per cent of what you find in 2G scam," former Goa CM Shri Manohar Parrikar said reporters in Panaji.

Seeking immediate removal of Kamat, he said the files show a "very clear nexus between the politicians and bureaucrats", while citing the instance of one particular file which he claimed has been cleared at all levels in just eight hours. He also alleged that there was an attempt to scuttle the PAC probe, which was based on documents from the mining and other concerned departments of the State.

# BJP unhappy over Centre's response to demand for power



Chief Minister Shri D.V.
Sadananda Gowda ruled out taking an all-party delegation to New Delhi to request the Centre and Union Ministers to help Karnataka with more power to tide over the crisis, especially after Union Power Minister Shushilkumar Shinde's

lukewarm response to Power Minister Shobha Karandlaje, when she met him and other Ministers from the State.

Speaking to presspersons at Krishna, the Chief Minister said there was no need to take the Opposition leaders to Delhi to convince the Centre, and added that his government would wait for some more time. However, he said, the government would initiate steps to reduce the hardship to the people affected by load shedding.

Shri Gowda said his government would come out with a White Paper in 10 days on what



happened in the power department in the State from 2000 to 2011, explaining the mistakes that were responsible for the present situation. Smt. Shobha Karandlaje was also present.

The Chief Minister said that thermal power units (TPS) would be set up in Gulbarga, Bijapur, Edlapura, Eramarus and third unit at Bellary Thermal Power Station. The Udupi Thermal Power Station unit would start generation of power from March next year. He urged the Union Power Ministry to ensure supply of coal supply to these units for ensuring uninterrupted generation. He said a proper coal linkage should be created for the purpose.

# BJP criticises Mamata's earlier ties with Maoists

The State leadership of the Bharatiya Janata Party criticises the role of Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee in handling the Maoist threat in West Bengal and for her earlier sympathies with them.
